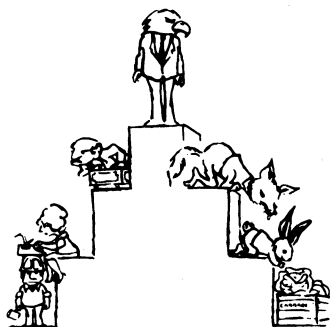

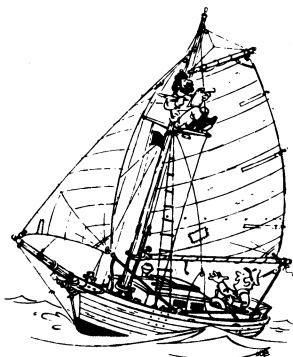

ADVENTURES OF A ZOOLOGIST—Victor B. Scheffer. Tells of the author's search for and pursuit of a career in zoology and recalls its liveliest moments. Describes the changing role of the zoologist over the last 50 years as the prime objective has evolved from one of merely classifying species to one of preserving and understanding species in order that we may come to understand ourselves and our place in the ecosystem. Scribner, 1980, 204 p., illus., \$10.

THE AMBIDEXTROUS UNIVERSE: Mirror Asymmetry and Time-Reversed Worlds—Martin Gardner. The second edition published in 1979 was revised, updated and expanded to include five new chapters on the latest speculations on time and how they relate to physics and cosmology. This edition is now available in paperback. Scribner, 2nd ed., 1980, 293 p., illus., paper, \$4.95.

BIAS IN MENTAL TESTING—Arthur R. Jensen. Examines the psychometric methods for objectively detecting bias in mental tests and for using tests fairly in any of the legitimate ways the tests may be employed. Jensen concludes that the most widely used standardized tests are not biased against any of the native-born, English-speaking minority groups for which sufficient data exist. Free Pr, 1980, 786 p., illus., \$29.95.

THE BROKEN TABOO: Sex in the Family—Blair Justice and Rita Justice. Examines what incest is, who commits it, why it occurs, what the consequences are and what can be done about the problem. Human Sci Pr, 1979, 304 p., \$10.95 (see p. 219).

CARNIVOROUS PLANTS—Adrian Slack. Most carnivorous plants stand alone in the plant world, not only in their unique way of supplementing their nutrition but in the extraordinary way their leaves have evolved from our idea of a typical leaf blade in order to catch and feed on animals. A beautiful book describing and illustrating carnivorous plants of the entire world. MIT Pr, 1980, 240 p., color and b&w illus., \$19.95.

HANDBOOK OF POISONING: Prevention, Diagnosis & Treatment—Robert H. Dreisbach. To provide a concise summary of the diagnosis and treatment of poisoning. Lange, 10th ed., 1980, 578 p., charts & graphs, paper, \$9.

THE !KUNG SAN: Men, Women, and Work in a Foraging Society—Richard Borshay Lee. An ecological and historical study of the !Kung San of Botswana, one of the very few remaining peoples of the world who live as hunters and gatherers. Cambridge U Pr, 1979, 526 p., illus., \$34.95, paper, \$10.95.

NEW WORLDS FOR OLD—Duncan Lunan. Presents the "new look" of the solar system made possible by space exploration discoveries. Based on a series of lectures and discussions held at the Association in Scotland to Research into Astronautics. The illustrations enhance the text. Morrow, 1979, 268 p., color and b&w illus., \$12.95.

SOCIOBIOLOGY: The Abridged Edition—Edward O. Wilson. In this shortened version of the original work on sociobiology, intended to serve the general reader and the student, the text has been trimmed to its essential introductory parts and the most interesting case histories while the basic structure of the original book has been retained. Because of the unusual amount of interest and commentary, the chapter on human social behavior has been left virtually intact. Harvard U Pr, 1980, 366 p., illus., paper, \$9.95.

STONES OF SILENCE: Journeys in the Himalaya—George B. Schaller. Dr. Schaller's aim was to find and observe rare species of flora and, more particularly, fauna. He came expecting to find some of the last truly wild terrain on earth; instead he saw an area devastated by erosion through human ignorance and carelessness. Whole species of animals are endangered. Viking Pr, 1980, 292 p., color and b&w illus., \$15.95.

TO SEE OUR WORLD—Catherine M. Young. A collection of beautiful artistic color photographs created to document the beauties of the natural world. With an essay by Margaret Atwood and quotations from the journals of Henry David Thoreau. Morrow, 1980, 127 p., color plates, \$29.95.

WORLD CLIMATE: The Weather, the Environment and Man—T. F. Gaskell and Martin Morris. A concise survey of weather and climate—what is known and what is still supposition and theory. Describes and illustrates the complex interaction of sun and earth, the continual restless churning of the atmosphere that makes the weather and the million-year-old fluctuations in climate.
