GREGORY BATESON: The Legacy of a Scientist — David Lipset. A biography of this distinguished anthropologist and social scientist that traces his intellectual evolution. Discusses the theories of aggression and the methods available to the psychologist in the measurement of aggression, aggressiveness and hostility. Presents the authors' research in attempting to validate a test of aggressiveness. Examines how the stable personality factors of aggressiveness and hostility may not be predictive of aggression. METRIC MANUAL — Lawrence D. Pedde et al. The system of measurement adopted by the United States in 1975 is called the International System of Units, abbreviated SI in all languages. This book, originally published in 1978 by the U.S. Department of Interior, Bureau of Reclamation, presents the basics of SI, metric conversion techniques, engineering applications, examples of conversion, engineering problems and formulae using SI units. MINIATURE ORCHIDS — Rebecca Tyson Northen. Describes for those who have not grown orchids before the basic needs of these flowers and successful ways of caring for them; discusses common problems and their solutions.
