Intended to get you out of the house or library and into the woods and fields, to give you a sense of the complexities and riches of the outdoors and to pique your curiosity so you will explore further the mysteries that are at work in any natural habitat. Focuses on origins, specifically the origins of culture, agriculture and complex societies, and concentrates on the archaeological record most directly related to these concerns. Surveys the simultaneous developments of seafaring technology and the uses of maritime transport in commerce and war throughout prehistoric Europe, Africa, Asia, the Pacific and the Americas.
