COLORS FROM THE EARTH: The Artists' Guide to Collecting, Preparing, and Using Them — Anne Wall Thomas. Covers the range of earth tones, ochres, siennas, umbers and terres vertes, and shows how to use them in conjunction with both professional materials and common household products to create oil paints, watercolors, temperas, pastels, crayons and painting inks, as well as colored concrete, plaster and handmade paper. The authors identify technological and institutional factors that decision-makers should be taking into account.
