**THE MAKING OF MANKIND** — Richard E. Leakey. A record of the evolution of mankind written by an anthropologist "who learned to recognize fossils almost before he could talk." **THE PENGUIN DICTIONARY OF MICROPROCESSORS** — Anthony Chandor. The computer industry generated new words and phrases, and many of these have been adapted and given new meaning in a microprocessor context. A number of new concepts have needed completely new words. This book does not seek to provide a preferred definition; therefore, all words and meanings relating to microprocessors qualify for inclusion. Penguin, 1981, 184 p., paper, \$5.95.

**PSYCHIATRY: A PERSONAL VIEW** — Milton H. Miller. Using case histories from his own practice, a leading psychiatrist explores the causes of mental illnesses and shows the general reader how psychiatry works to treat these illnesses successfully. **THE SHY CHILD: A Parent's Guide to Preventing and Overcoming Shyness from Infancy to Adulthood** — Philip G. Zimbardo and Shirley L. Radl. A comprehensive reference book on insomnia and narcolepsy for the physician, the mental health worker and students in medical and graduate schools. 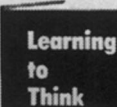

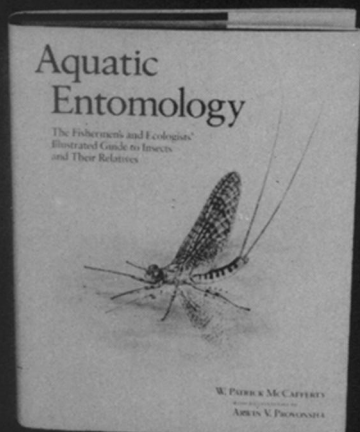
