The immense world of a billion galaxies lying beyond our own is the purview of this book written by the principal astronomer at the Paris Observatory for the general reader. MAYA: The Riddle and Rediscovery of a Lost Civilization — Charles Gallenkamp. The first edition of this book was published in 1959. Since then intensive research necessitated the updating and expansion of the original text in 1976. The continuing disclosure of new data has required the inclusion of additional changes in the present edition to reflect the new ideas regarding the nature of Maya society. MEDICAL THINKING: A Historical Preface — Lester S. King. The problem of the medical profession over the ages remains the same—the physician tries to identify the disease from which the patient suffers, to determine its causes and to provide remedies that seem appropriate. In finding these answers decisions must be made that require critical judgment. To illustrate his points the author gives a detailed history of a single disease, tuberculosis. NORTH AMERICAN GAME BIRDS AND MAMMALS — A. Starker Leopold, Ralph J. Gutiérrez and Michael T. Bronson. The emphasis in this book is on the salient facts of natural history, geographic distribution and ecological status of the game birds and mammals. Designed to serve as a companion to a field guide. THE SEARCH FOR LIFE ON MARS: Evolution of an Idea — Henry S. F. Cooper, Jr. Recounts the story of the personalities and events involved in the search for life on Mars. The first part of the book profiles Carl Sagan and tells of this astrophysicist's work on the Viking Project. The author then moves on to the other principal scientists involved and their work leading up to the landings and the biological experiments conducted by the Viking landers on Mars. 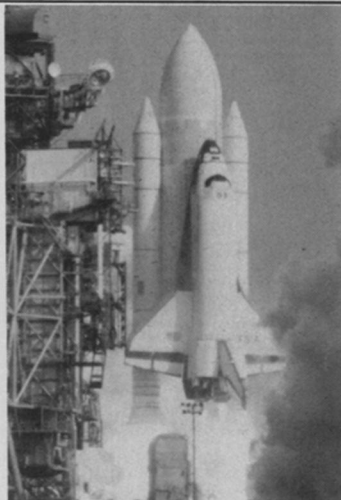
