The Analytic Attitude — Roy Schafer. Explores the intellectual and emotional attitude adopted by the psychoanalyst at work. Discusses neutrality, discipline, empathy, authenticity, fidelity to a system of psychoanalytic thought and practice and the tensions inherent in the analyst's professional development and daily work. Basic, 1983, 316 p., \$20.95.

The Best Science Films, Filmstrips, and Videocassettes for Children — Kathryn Wolff et al., Eds. Provides summaries and evaluations by scientists of more than 500 of the best children's science and mathematics audio/visual programs produced during the past 10 years. Entries are arranged by subject category, indicate an appropriate audience age and include information on how to order the programs. AAAS, 1982, 140 p., \$12.95.

The Camel: Its Evolution, Ecology, Behavior, and Relationship to Man — Hilde Gauthier-Pilters and Anne Innis Dagg. Describes the camel in its natural habitat in the northwestern and western Sahara and points out the importance of camel men in the ecology of the desert, "for without them, there would be no camels to utilize the desert's resources." Cosmic Horizons: Understanding the Universe — Robert V. Wagoner and Donald W. Goldsmith. The authors explore the most remote frontiers, the vast reaches of space and time that encompass the known universe. Cosmology, the study of the universe as a whole, is emphasized. Among topics discussed are changing concepts of the cosmos, the significance of the elementary particles in the development of the universe and cosmic evolution. The Dance of Life: The Other Dimension of Time — Edward T. Hall. Tells how time is consciously as well as unconsciously formulated, used and patterned in different cultures. The author feels for one to function effectively in a culturally alien environment, it is just as important to learn the language of time as it is to learn the spoken language. Doubleday, 1983, 232 p., \$15.95.

The Light Fantastic — Peter Mason. The story of the science and technology of inventions associated with light and light waves such as the electric light, the microscope, photography and lasers. Tells how the inventions have changed the whole pattern of human life. Penguin, 1982, 248 p., illus., paper, \$5.95.

The Mammalian Radiations: An Analysis of Trends in Evolution, Adaptation, and Behavior — John F. Eisenberg. A comprehensive synthesis of mammalian behavior, ecology and morphology from an evolutionary perspective. Originally published in hardback in 1981. 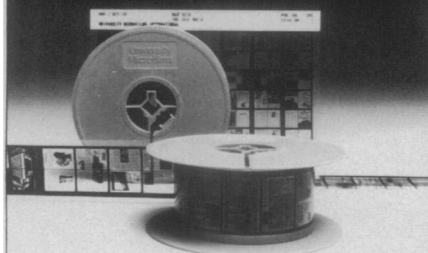

Synergetics 2: Explorations in the Geometry of Thinking — R. Buckminster Fuller with E. J. Applewhite. Continues, according to the introduction, the exposition of Fuller's radical geometrical cosmos with its landscapes of unfamiliar models and metaphors begun in *Synergetics 1*. It amplifies and amends, but does not supersede, the earlier volume published in 1975. This volume makes more explicit the significance of certain geometrical functions that are only implicit in the previous work. Originally published in hardback in 1979. Unlock Your Child's Potential — Dean L. Hummel and Carl McDaniels. Specific steps are outlined that can be used by parents to help children starting from the age of two up to young adults in career awareness and decision making.
