Simonds. A book to stimulate your interest in the  
common birds around your home. Includes  
chapters on ten familiar birds: swallows, mock-  
ingbirds, blue jays, chickadees, song sparrows,  
robins, English sparrows, phoebes, rewding  
blackbirds and crows. Drawing mainly on his  
own experience as a garden bird watcher, this  
animal behavioral scientist describes the bird's  
nesting habits, how they care for their young  
and how they use their songs and sounds to

**Tropical Nature**—Adrian Forsyth and Kenneth  
Miyata. Introduces the general reader to the rain  
forests of Central and South America. The au-  
thors who are biologists describe this lush habi-

tion, then they unravel it to reveal the complex  
relationships between the organisms that reside
