



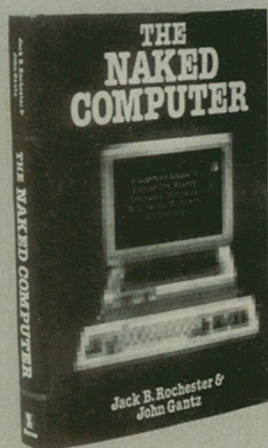


FOR COMPUTER TRIVIA BUFFS
