This book analyzes the adolescence experience, describes the usual and the unusual psychological changes that occur during adolescence and discusses the many different implications and ways of dealing with these changes. Brain Building: Easy Games to Develop Your Problem-Solving Skills — Karl Albrecht. A book of mental exercises, using easy thinking problems for practice and skill-building. Cloning and the New Genetics—Margaret O. Hyde and Lawrence E. Hyde. A simple science book that explains the role of DNA in heredity, tells how genetic characteristics are inherited and how cloning works. Describes DNA's use in medicine, agriculture and industry. Improving World Health: A Least Cost Strategy — William U. Chandler. A large number of early deaths are preventable, says this report, and these lives can be saved at a surprisingly low cost. Those from developed nations die of heart disease and cancer; those from developing nations die of diarrhea, pneumonia and measles. 
Insects — Bernhard Grzimek, Editor-in-Chief. As in all the volumes of Grzimek's *Animal Life Encyclopedia*, the color photographs and illustrations are outstanding. Volume II begins with an introduction to the insects, which is followed by a systematic treatment of insects beginning with the most primitive. Many, but not all, insect species are covered. The English edition of Grzimek's *Animal Life Encyclopedia* was originally published in hardback in 1975. Van Nos Reinhold, 1984, 643 p., color/b&w illus., paper, \$24.95.

Lower Animals — Bernhard Grzimek, Editorin-Chief. Beautiful color illustrations enhance the text of Volume I of Grzimek's 13-volume Animal Life Encyclopedia, prepared by specialists from various disciplines. This volume covers 19 phyla including such animals as protozoa, flatworms, coelenterates, arachnids and crustaceans. The English edition of this encyclopedia was originally published in 1975. Margaret Mead: A Life — Jane Howard. This engrossing book is, according to the preface, "a generalist's portrait, nonpartisan, drawn from books, articles and correspondence, but most of all from talks on three continents, over five years, with some 300 of the people whose lives were changed because they knew her." Serengeti: Dynamics of an Ecosystem — A.R.E. Sinclair and M. Norton-Griffiths. The Serengeti is one of the few areas of the world that has not suffered the ravages of modern man, says the preface. It contains the largest herds of grazing mammals in the world. In the 1950s a group of scientists began studying a wide range of topics including the area's biology, soils, geology and climate to obtain sufficient understanding of how the ecosystem worked so they could advise on the proper conservation of the area. Uncommon Sense: The Life and Thought of Ludwig von Bertalanffy (1901-1972) — Mark Davidson, foreword by R. Buckminster Fuller, introduction by Kenneth E. Boulding. A biography of this little-known scientific genius of our era, the founder of general systems theory (GST). This is a way of looking at a wide range of problems with insights from knowledge about the way natural systems behave. Originally published in hardback in 1983.
