

In the Rainforest — Catherine Caufield. Takes the reader to Africa, South and Central America and Asia, revealing a world where butterflies have wingspans of 7 inches, spiders prey on birds and grasses grow 60 feet in height. Estimates for the destruction of tropical forests range up to 50 million acres a year. As the forests are destroyed, millions of plants and animals as well as human forest dwellers lose their habitats. "Fewer than 1 percent of tropical forest species" says the author, "have been examined for their possible use to mankind." Delves into the reasons for the destruction of these fragile ecosystems.
