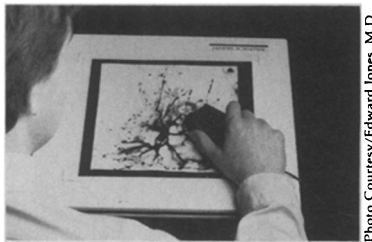

Biotechnology: Strategies for Life — Elizabeth Antébi and David Fishlock. This beautifully illustrated book presents the history of biotechnology and explains the techniques and tools used, such as genetic engineering, fermentation, enzymes, cell fusion, monoclonal antibodies and microbiological engineering. Discusses the applications for biotechnology in medicine, food and animal feeds, seeds, plants, energy, pollution, mining and biomaterials. Tells of the international economic stakes for industry and investors and indicates the effect of biotechnology on people's lives for the foreseeable future. Originally published in French. MIT Pr, 1986, 239 p., color illus., \$39.95.

Children with Cancer: A Comprehensive Reference Guide for Parents — Jeanne Munn Bracken. A parent whose child survived cancer pulls together here a wealth of information on childhood cancers for the layperson concerned with a child who has cancer. The information ranges from hard-to-locate medical facts to practical tips on how to handle side effects and deal with curious strangers. Oxford U Pr, 1986, 407 p., illus., \$22.95.

Dictionary of Pharmacy — Julian H. Fincher, Editor-in-Chief. Defines terms and expressions used in the pharmaceutical sciences. The appendices include various weights and measures, abbreviations and acronyms. U of SC Pr, 1986, 374 p., \$24.95.

Encyclopedic Dictionary of Sports Medicine

— David F. Tver and Howard F. Hunt. For those interested in understanding, preventing or treating injuries sustained during physical activity or sports. The definitions are arranged alphabetically according to sport, body part and ailment. 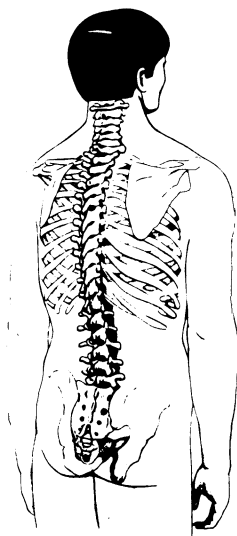
Ice Ages: Solving the Mystery — John Imbrie and Katherine Palmer Imbrie. Explains the causes of ice ages, gives the history of this relatively recent discovery, tells of the outstanding scientists who have been involved in the study of the ice ages and predicts when the next ice age will occur. Originally published in hardback in 1979 by Enslow Pubs. For this paperback edition the Chronology of Discovery has been updated to 1985, as has the bibliography. Harvard U Pr, 1986, 224 p., illus., paper, \$7.95.

Preservation of Historical Records — National Research Council. Examines various methods for preserving paper records and assesses alternative actions for preserving original documents or copying the information contained in them. Environmental effects on documents are discussed. (See SN:9/6/86, p. 153.) Natl Acad Pr, 1986, 108 p., illus. \$15.75.

Silent Partners: The Legacy of the Ape Language Experiments — Eugene Linden. Explains the complex situations and emotions that led to the end of most of the once-promising ape language experiments. Explores the fate of the celebrated apes that learned to communicate in sign language. Times Bks, 1986, 247 p., \$17.95.
