Ape Language: From Conditioned Response to Symbol — E. Sue Savage-Rumbaugh, foreword by Herbert S. Terrace. The research described here is about the ways the language-using behavior of apes can come to be similar to the language of 1- and 2-year-old children and about the behavioral changes that take place in the apes as this happens. The researchers have attempted, according to the preface, to determine what the apes can and cannot learn to do with symbols, how they move from simple responses to referential communicative symbol usage and how these research findings could apply to human beings who have difficulties acquiring language. Deep Black: Space Espionage and National Security — William E. Burrows. The story of our space reconnaissance and surveillance system, with which the U.S. monitors the world electronically each day. Reports on low-orbiting satellites that record images of events, and on satellites more than 20,000 miles out in space that can eavesdrop on military and civilian communications around the world. Tells of the people and agencies that conceive, produce and control the various intelligence-collection systems, who interpret and analyze the information gathered and thereby, according to the preface, formulate national policy.
