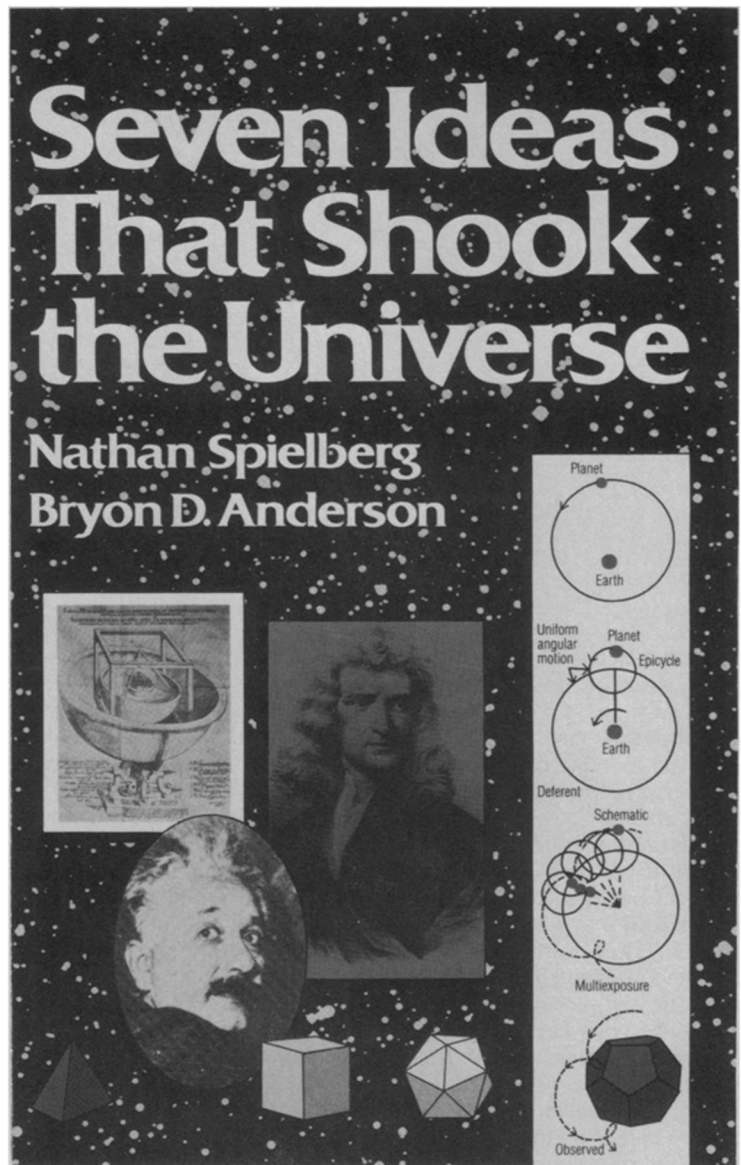

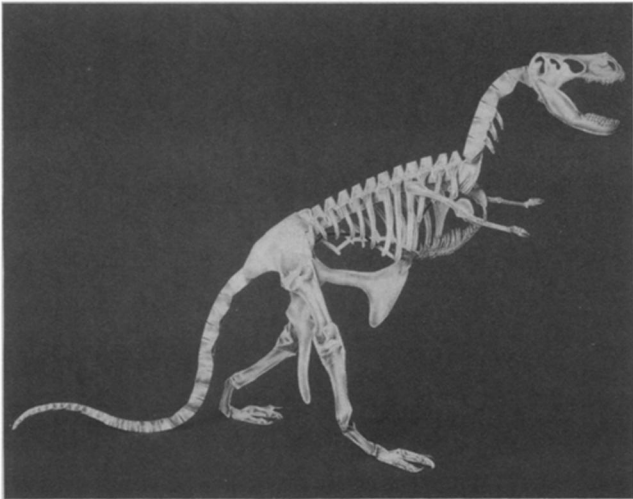

The kit contains: Inside covers that become a wall poster with full-color photographs and informative text on dinosaurs, particularly the Tyrannosaurus rex; four pages of step-by-step instructions; eight pages of heavy-stock, ready-to-cut-out-and-assemble dinosaur bones to make a paper dinosaur skeleton that is almost 4 feet long from its

gaping jaw to its powerful swinging tail! And an illustrated history of how dinosaurs lived by the celebrated author Isaac Asimov.

# Atlas of Ancient America

**T**his color-illustrated atlas explores the culture and behavior of ancient North, South and Meso American peoples. After a general discussion of the distribution, languages and environment of the American cultures, the clear text offers a survey of the major Indian groups, including Hopi, Iroquois, Maya, Aztec, Nacza and Inca. Topics of popular interest such as the Jaguar cults, the Nacza desert lines, the Hopewell burial mounds and Mayan writing are studied in depth. Special sidebars throughout focus on textile production, ritual masks and religious rituals. Location maps, comparative charts, drawings and photographs representing ancient archaeological sites and artifacts further supplement this exemplary work. Filled with colorful maps, photographs and other illustrations, this large-format volume surveys the climate, geography, civilization and history of North, Central and South America. — *Booklist*
