The ABCs of Prescription Drugs — Edward Edelson, with introduction by Dr. John L. Colaizzi. The book is arranged by diseases or disorders. Each section begins with a description of the disease and of the drugs that are prescribed for it. Each drug is then listed by its generic name and the most widely used brand name or names. General precautions, directions for use, common and less common side effects, drug interactions, effects of overdose and comments on use during pregnancy and breast-feeding, use by older persons and use with alcohol and caffeine are given for each drug. The index lists generic drugs, brand-named drugs and diseases and disorders. Doubleday, 1987, 275 p., \$12.95.

Beyond the Acropolis: A Rural Greek Past — Tjeerd H. van Andel and Curtis Runnels. A four-year archaeological survey studied Greek country life in the southern Argolid from its beginnings tens of thousands of years ago until the recent past. This book, intended for the general reader, presents archaeological, geological and anthropological findings for those interested in Greece and its role in history and civilization. Stanford U Pr, 1987, 221 p., illus., \$27.50.

The Cosmos from Space — David H. Clark. Traces for the general reader the evolution of our understanding of the universe, which has been made possible by scientific instruments launched above the atmosphere on rockets and satellites. X-rays from celestial objects reveal sites of violent upheaval and change; infrared radiation locates the birthplace of stars; and other radiations reveal objects and phenomena also unobservable from the earth's surface. Emergency Response to Chemical Accidents: Planning and Coordinating Solutions — James T. O'Reilly. Explains the types of planning that local communities should undertake in order to respond to potential chemical releases, fires or accidents. Explores how the new Superfund law is likely to affect state and local regulation of chemicals. McGraw, 1987, 378 p., \$39.50.

Penguins — John Sparks and Tony Soper. These are birds that don't fly but swim superbly. Here the life cycle of the penguin is described in detail and is well illustrated. The author then discusses food, predators and evolution of penguins. Tells of the penguin's discovery and exploitation by humans. Seventeen species are described. Facts on File, 1987, 246 p., color/b&w illus., \$19.95.


Radon: The Invisible Threat — Michael Lafavore. Radon is a colorless, odorless and tasteless radioactive gas. This book explains where this natural, background radiation comes from and how it can contaminate homes, especially energy-efficient ones. Contains lists of federal and state agencies that can provide further information on whether radon problems have been identified in your area and, if so, what is being done about them. Discusses how to test a home for radon and supplies a list of radon testing services. A kit is provided with the book which can be used for radon testing and sent in for analysis along with a fee of approximately \$12. Rodale Pr, 1987, 256 p., illus., paper, \$12.95.
