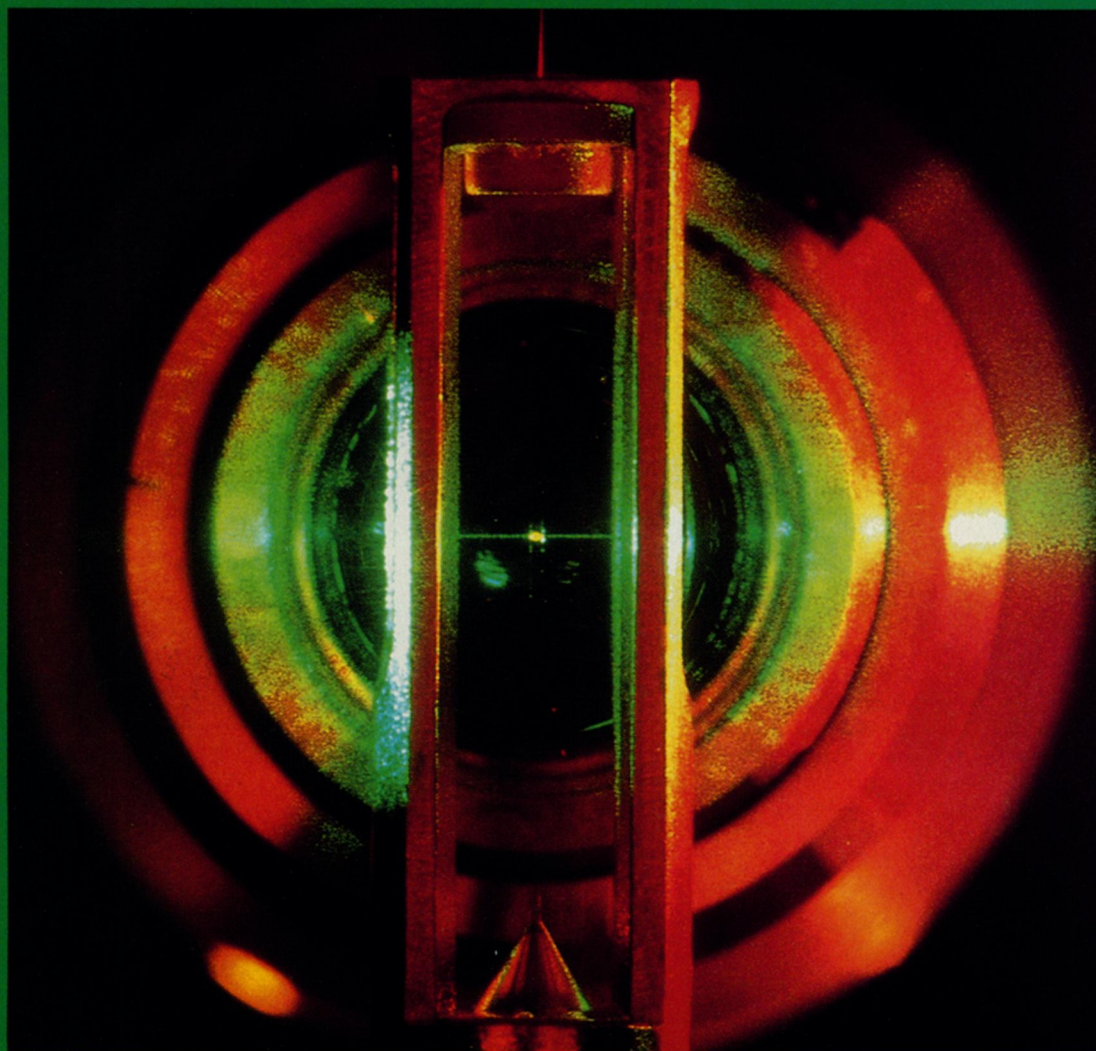


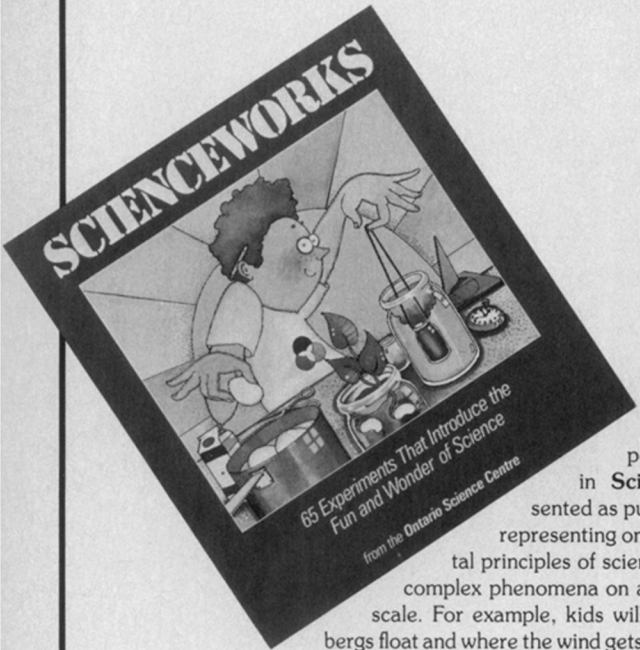

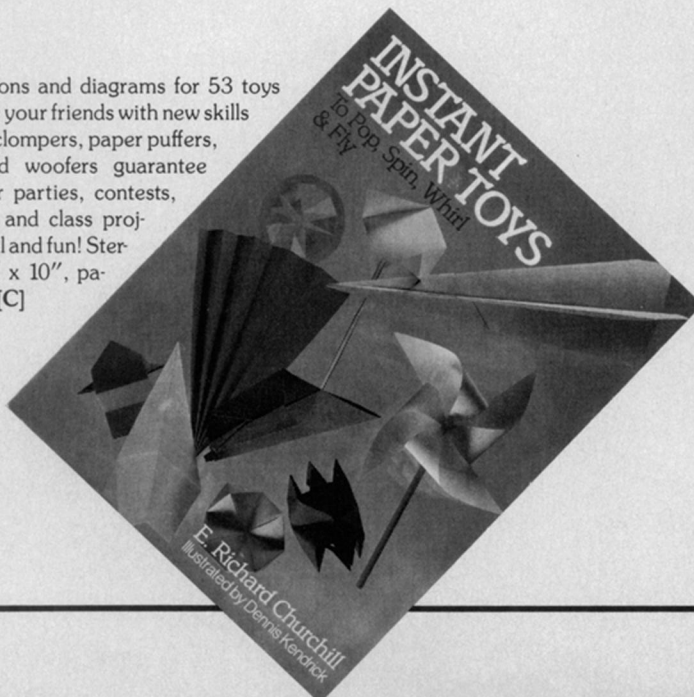
Measuring Molecules: It's a Small World

Hands-on Projects for Kids and Adults

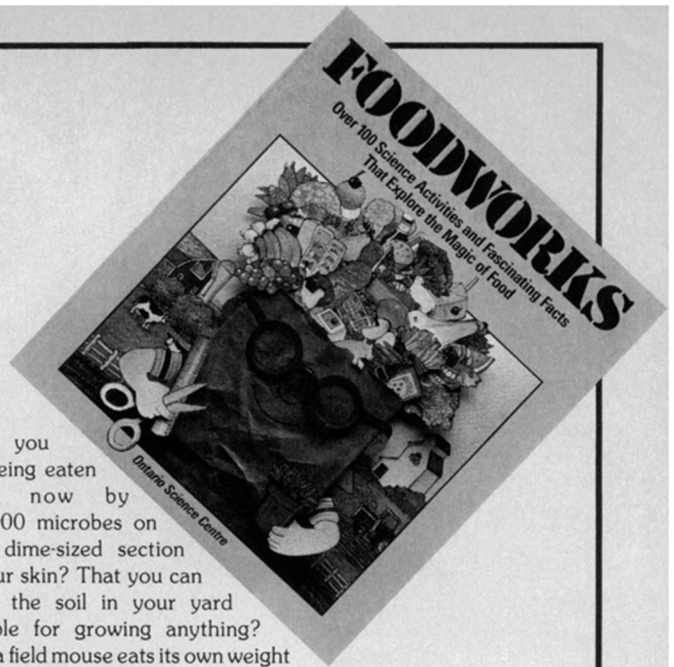
