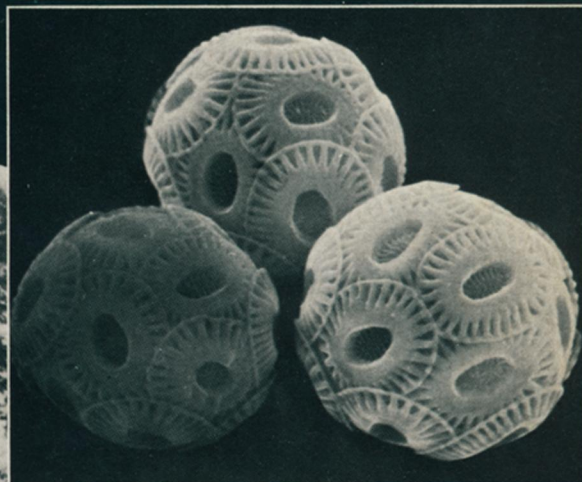

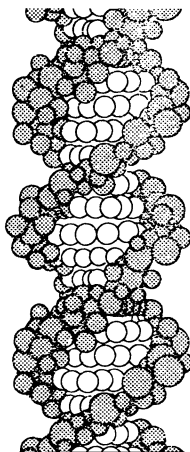


# In Search of the Double Helix

**A**claimed science writer John Gribbin draws on his expertise in quantum physics to tell the story of one of the greatest and most dramatic discoveries of twentieth-century science. His search for the elusive double helix takes us through the twists and turns of disappointment and discovery on a fascinating quest to the source of life itself. In clear, straightforward language, he presents the lives and thoughts of the men and women whose pioneering work in physics, biology, genetics and chemistry combined to provide a basic understanding of how life evolved — and continues to evolve — on earth. He follows the trail of discovery from X-rays, mutations, quantum mechanics, the molecular clock and sexual reproduction — all the way to the innermost workings of the human cell. And he shows how modern science first learned to “crack” the genetic code of life and the profound consequences this new knowledge will have on our future.

Now stargazers from both hemispheres can share ESO's explorations through 90 color plates and 147 black-and-white photographs that provide breathtaking testimony to the state-of-the-art combination of astro-photographic and printing technology. Extensive captions by the expert author team, 31 reference maps, tables of plate data and indexes complement the images, enabling readers to locate and understand the significance of each object. Of special interest are photographs of recent Southern Sky events like Supernova 1987A and Halley's Comet, and a four-foot, panoramic poster of the Milky Way as it appears to a nighttime observer.
