Presented in groups according to behavior and habitat, these birds include waterfowl — geese, ducks and swans — and any bird that hunts, feeds or swims in fresh or salt water. The dramatic images show the elegant courtship ceremony of Japanese cranes and the moonlit hunt of a Pel's fishing owl in Botswana; snowbound penguins patiently tending their young and Western grebes as they dance like acrobats across a prairie lake in Canada.
