

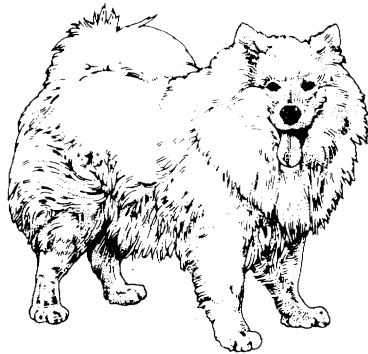


# THE PERFECT PUPPY

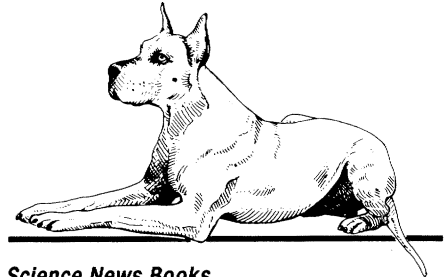
