


ANCIENT EGYPT

o the ancient Egyptians themselves a mummy was not an object of curiosity but the focus of a complex burial ritual, and a fine statue made for a temple sanctuary was an object of worship, not a work of art. To illuminate the real significance of Egypt's legacy, James takes the reader back to the sites from which such pieces came. He follows the Nile from the Delta to Nubia, via the great monuments of Memphis, Abydos and Thebes, and shows why these places were to provide such superb evidence of the Egyptian achievement. His evocative text and the more than 120 color and black and white illustrations combine to produce a book which will make a visit to the Egyptian galleries of a museum, or a journey to Egypt itself, a very much more rewarding experience.




