



- A man with a mental age of an 11-year-old and a vocabulary of 58 words who can give the population of every city and large town in the United States, the names and locations of 2,000 of the country's leading hotels, statistics on 3,000 mountains and rivers and the essential facts about 2,000 inventions and discoveries;
- A blind girl with an I.Q. under 50 who can sing and play on the piano the entire soundtrack of a Broadway musical after hearing it just once;
- A young man with an I.Q. of 50 and severely limited verbal abilities who can create magnificent clay animal sculptures in lifelike detail in less than an hour;
- A boy who cannot dress or feed himself nor communicate the simplest of thoughts but can compute the cube root of an eight-figure number in only a few seconds . . .

These are examples of Savant Syndrome, an exceedingly rare condition in which persons have spectacular "islands of genius" that stand in stark contrast to their mental handicaps. In *Extraordinary People*, psychiatrist Treffert pulls together for the first time a summary of reported cases and the observations of their chroniclers; describes in detail a number of new cases; outlines new theories put forward by various investigators; highlights new research and discusses the far-reaching implications Savant Syndrome has for understanding normal brain function. Readers will be introduced to some famous historical savants, such as the institutionalized seventeenth- and eighteenth-century artist Gottefried Mind, "the Cats' Raphael," and the blind American slave and musical prodigy known as Blind Tom.
