Whether a bark or rock painting, carved tree, painted tennis shoe or poster, these magnificent artworks share a remarkable consistency from the prehistoric era to the present. Polar Bears — Ian Stirling, photographs by Dan Guravich. A rich resource of polar-bear fact and photo. The text is a serious study of the animal's distribution and abundance, reproduction, behavior, life and death and conflicts with humans. The photographs depict a superbly adapted marine hunter and arctic survivor that can act eerily humanlike at times. U of Mich Pr, 1988, 220 p., color/b&w illus., hardcover, \$39.50.

This Incomparable Land: A Book of American Nature Writing — Thomas J. Lyon, Ed. A history — including a taxonomy, a chronology and a discussion of modern developments — of this often overlooked specialty of U.S. nonfiction. The bulk of the book is an anthology of natural history writers, including William Wood, John James Audubon, John Muir, Henry David Thoreau and Annie Dillard. An extensive bibliography completes the book. H-M, 1989, 495 p., hardcover, \$29.95.

Uranium Frenzy: Boom and Bust on the Colorado Plateau — Raye Ringholz. The story of the uranium mining boom on the Colorado Plateau in the 1950s, as told to the writer through interviews and from her personal experiences in a mining town. Tells of fortunes made and lost and the tragic health consequences resulting when miners ignored warnings of radon hazards in the mines. Ringholz says this period in history is exceptional because of the public health consequences and because "it was perhaps the last time that an ordinary individual could wrest riches from the earth with his own two hands." Norton, 1989, 310 p., illus., hardcover, \$18.95.
