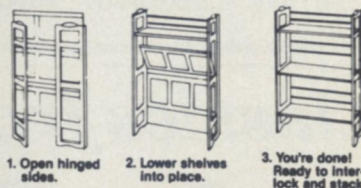

Classics from Ernest Thompson Seton



Ernest Thompson Seton was a naturalist, artist, writer, lecturer, story-teller, educator and explorer. Three generations of boys and girls grew up on his animal stories; **Wild Animals I Have Known** sold several hundred thousand copies between its release in 1898 and the author's death in 1946. Seton founded the first nationwide boy's organization in North America and later became the first Chief Scout of the Boy Scouts of America. His final years were spent in New Mexico, where he built Seton Village in the heart of Navajo country and taught people the Indian way of life. For many, Seton remains the greatest of all animal story writers. Those who first read about Lobo and

Raggylug and Vixen fifty or sixty years ago can retell their stories in detail even now, often repeating the exact phrasing by Seton. They can tell you about Silverspot, a truly successful crow; how to set a wolf trap that will trap a wolf and spare a dog, from *Bingo, the Story of My Dog*; and about the adventures of *Johnny Bear* and one large syrup can.
