## Kingdom of the Ice Bear picture puzzles





The Arctic – the largest untouched wilderness left on earth is a vast pristine area of frozen land and sea that crowns the northern boundaries of Alaska. Canada, Greenland, Scandinavia and the Soviet Union. Often characterized as a lifeless desert of ice and snow, the Arctic is in fact a unique area of rare and subtle beauty. Even in such hostile conditions, a fascinating range of animals — like the shaggy-haired musk ox, Arctic hare, Arctic fox and ptarmigan — have adapted to survive and even flourish on the frontier of existence. Flora and fauna come to life on this 28" x 20", 1000-piece jigsaw puzzle of Arctic land wildlife. \$15.95 (Pictured above.)

The ocean surrounding the North Pole remains permanently frozen, but over the rest of the Arctic seas the ice breaks up and re-freezes each year. Resident ringed seals, bearded seals and walruses, keep breathing-holes open in the ice throughout the winter and spring or live in the areas of permanent open water called polynyas. Male polar bears wander the frozen ocean in search of ringed seals, while in March the female bears emerge with their new-born cubs from winter maternity dens dug in snow banks the previous November. Marine wildlife of the Arctic comes to life on this 28" x 20", 1000-piece jigsaw puzzle. \$15.95 (Pietured above.)
