


Suds in Flux



Birding by Ear, Eastern/Central provides a system for learning bird song in general, including unfamiliar and new songs and calls. As you proceed through the learning groups such as mimics, whistlers and name-sayers, you will develop techniques and vocabulary useful in characterizing and recalling bird song. Just as there is nothing magical about the visual skills of the expert birder in the field, there is little mystery to learning bird song. Work with the tapes and apply your learning in the field. Also, be prepared for variations in bird song. Just as the bird in the field may not look exactly like the one in your field guide, the song may sound somewhat different from the samples on the tapes. Three cassette tapes accompany a booklet showing a line drawing of each bird and briefly describing its habitat and voice characteristics. Eighty-five common species are grouped by their audio similarity into seven learning categories. Good for the beginning birder or the advanced visual birder. Each bird is further identified in color in A Field Guide to the Birds, Eastern/Central North America, which is also available.

"Birding by Ear is a unique and important new tool for birders. Now they can easily master one of the most useful and difficult field skills—

the ability to recognize birds by their songs and calls. Just as my field guide shows what to look for, Birding by Ear points out exactly what to listen for to tell one bird from another. The entertaining and educational narrative does the same job as the arrows in my field guide, pinpointing the precise differences between similar species. The songs themselves are recorded to the highest acoustic standards and are a delight to listen to. Birding by Ear can enable anyone to become a better birder. It may well become as essential to you as your field guide and binoculars."
