


The Kingdom: Wildlife in North America presents a new vision of the living kingdom around us. poses vital questions: How have animals influenced us, and what changes have we imposed on wildlife communities? How might humans interact more meaningfully with the other inhabitants of North America? What does the future hold for all creatures of the kingdom as we approach the end of the twentieth century?

Together, Wolfe's spectacular photographs and Chadwick's eloquent text reveal wild creatures in a new light and provide a heartfelt plea for preserving not just the animals but what they have to teach us about our own lives.  $- from \ the \ publisher$
