In 1939, just before the outbreak of war, Winston Churchill had completed the original draft of his great History. A *tour-de-force* of language and ideas, this massive work amply demonstrates the wisdom of the Nobel Prize for Literature "for mastery in historical and biographical presentation."

Volume One: The Birth of Britain. Churchill brilliantly recounts the story of the leadership of Alfred the Great, the invasion of the Danes, Romans and Normans, and the Wars of the Roses, concluding with the founding of the Tudor dynasty in 1485 on the eve of the discovery of America. 521pp.

Volume Two: The New World. A colorful portrayal of a galaxy of great personages and stirring events: Henry VIII, Mary Queen of Scots, Good Queen Bess and the defeat of the Armada and the sailing of the Mayflower (to mention just a few), ending with the escape of James II in 1688. 433pp.

Volume Three: The Age of Revolution, from 1688 to 1815. Churchill paints a vivid portrait of the momentous events of this memorable period and the people who played major parts—people like Marlborough, Napoleon, Nelson, Washington, Franklin, to name a few. 402pp.




