Cold Fusion: The Making of a Scientific Controversy — F. David Peat. Guides the general reader through the cold fusion debate, starting with the March 1989 announcement of controlled nuclear fusion in a laboratory setting and proceeding through the denouncements of that claim to some ongoing experiments that continue to yield unexplained results. Peat, the author of Superstrings and the Search for the Theory of Everything, explains the process of cold fusion and its possible implications for meeting future energy needs. Creatures, Corals, and Colors — David L. Bull and Ann Scarborough-Bull. A celebration of the seafloor's colorful pageantry, from the chilly kelp forests off the southern California coast to the psychedelic coral gardens of the Caribbean. The text, spectacularly illustrated with more than 150 color photographs, explores the natural history of unique underwater habitats, introducing the general reader to the creatures of the deep and examining their mysterious coexistence. The Discovery of the Bismarck — Robert D. Ballard. It took two years and a painstaking sonar survey of 100 square miles of seafloor before Ballard and his crew located the *Bismarck*, Hitter's greatest battleship. This gripping account of the *Bismarck*'s maiden journey, her sinking, Ballard's search, her discovery and her exploration is generously illustrated with historical and underwater photographs as well as artists' renderings. The First Weeks of Life — Miriam Stoppard. This comprehensive guide begins by familiarizing mothers with their newborn's appearance and behavior and continues through care and feeding in the hospital and at home. Chapters are extensively illustrated with photographs and diagrams, providing fundamental information such as how to clean and change newborns and how to warm bottles or remove a nursing baby from the breast. Lonely Hearts of the Cosmos: The Story of the Scientific Quest for the Secret of the Universe — Dennis Overbye. A history of cosmology — the scientific effort to determine the origin and fate of the universe — and an introduction to cosmologists who have probed phenomena ranging from black holes to an expanding universe. Writing for the general reader, Overbye conveys the inspiration, excitement and frustration of this cosmic quest. HarperCollins, 1990, 438 p., hardcover, \$25.00.

The Second Fifty Years: Promoting Health and Preventing Disability — Robert L. Berg and Joseph S. Cassells, Eds. This report, compiled by the Institute of Medicine, examines 13 health threats to the elderly and offers policy and research recommendations to improve the quality of life and health care for the aging U.S. population. What Light Through Yonder Window Breaks? More Experiments in Atmospheric Physics — Craig F. Bohren. In this sequel to Clouds in a Glass of Beer, Bohren continues to explore the world of atmospheric physics, explaining such everyday phenomena as highway mirages and winter frost on the inside of windows. Written for science enthusiasts interested in the physics of everyday life, the book reflects both the curiosity and the skepticism with which scientists approach the world. Wiley, 1991, 190 p., illus., paperback, \$12.95.
