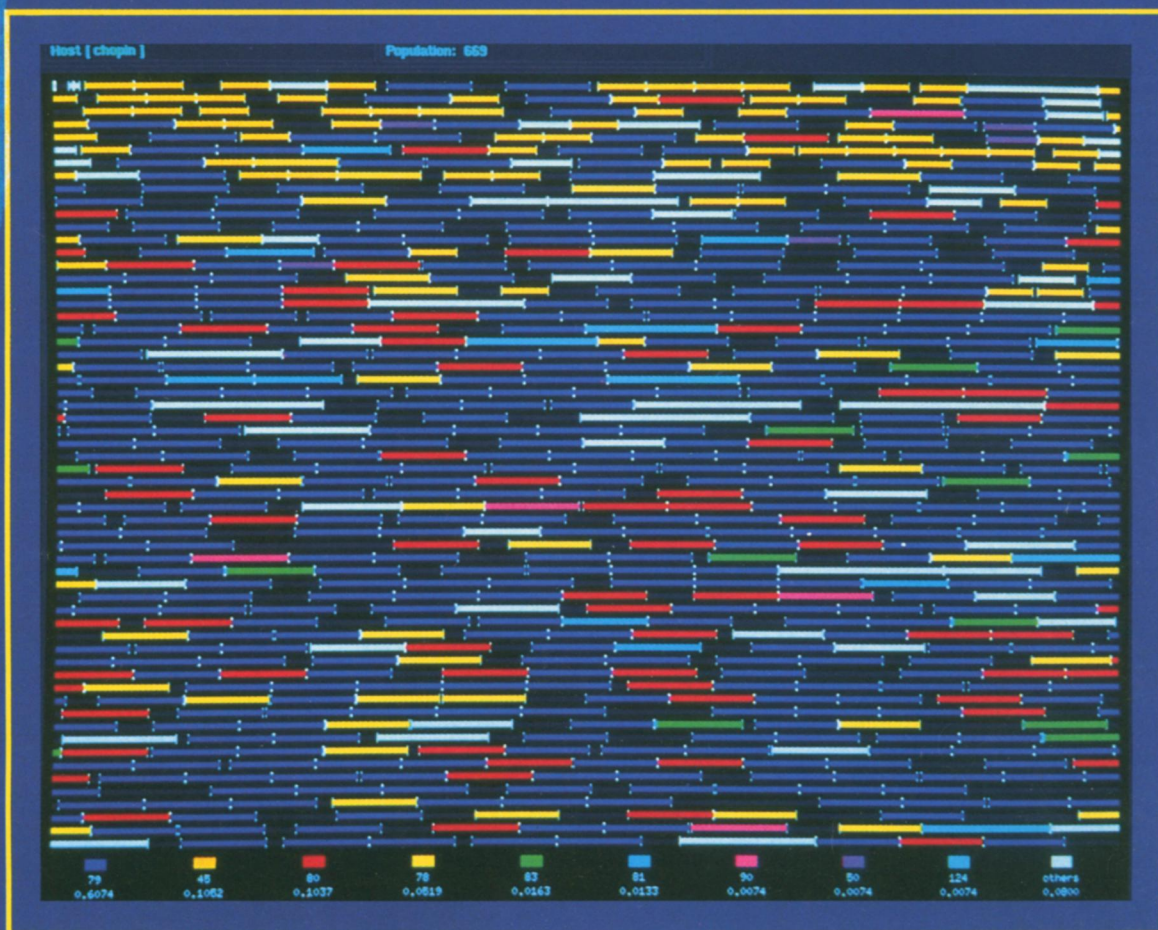

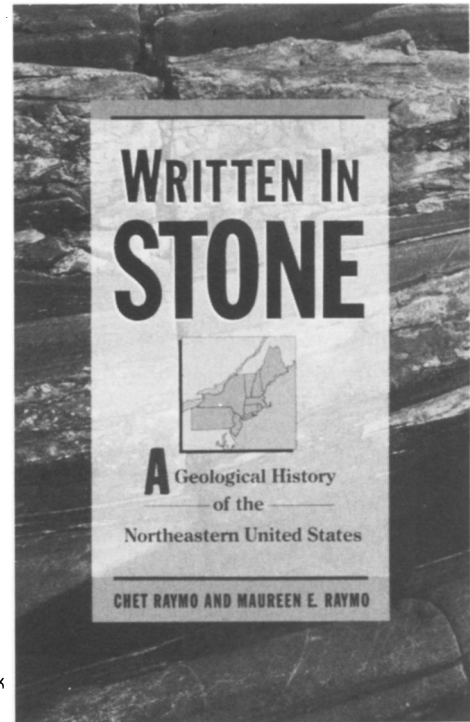

Digital Darwinism

Written in Stone traces one particular grain of our planet — the northeastern United States — across 500 million years of geological history to reveal the dynamic face and forces of the Earth that have shaped this familiar landscape. From New Jersey north to Maine, from the Adirondacks east to Cape Cod, **Written in Stone** reads the history of this region in sand and stones, ponds and valleys, hills and ridges. The story is a masterful translation of the dramas that preceded and created the horizons we know today. The authors explore the tearing down and reconstruction of land; mass extinctions; fossil records; past climates; the birth of oceans; the dynamics of evolution; the rifting of the ocean floor; the movement of glaciers; the evolution of plants and animals; and the coming of humans. The book describes how earthquakes are a window into the geologic past. It explains the Northeast's oldest and youngest features. It draws fascinating comparisons between present-day East Africa and the Northeast of the Triassic Period. It locates the path of the glaciers in the drumlins of the Boston area, the eskers of Maine and the kettle holes of Cape Cod. Presented in a nontechnical, engaging style, this book will captivate the interested layperson and refresh the professional.
