Are You at Risk? How to Identify and Reduce Your Risk For More than 100 Diseases and Medical Conditions — Carol Ann Rinzler. Explains for the general reader whether factors such as age, environment, gender, smoking, family history and occupation can affect a person's susceptibility to conditions such as obesity, lung cancer, migraines, strokes and lupus. For each condition, Rinzler describes practical methods of risk reduction. A helpful appendix lists organizations that provide information or referrals on many of these disorders. Facts on File, 1991, 208 p., hardcover, \$21.95.

The Astronomer's Universe: Stars, Galaxies and Cosmos - Herbert Friedman. An accessible introduction to the amazing astronomical finds of the late 20th century. Friedman, an astronomer, discusses radio waves, infrared radiation, red giants, white dwarfs, black holes, neutron stars, quasars, the search for life in the universe and more. He vividly portrays scientists past and present who have dedicated themselves to the stars; the text is sprinkled with stellar allusions drawn from songs and poetry. Includes a helpful glossary of astronomical terms. Originally published in hardcover in 1990. Ballantine, 1991, 359 p., illus., paperback, \$14.00.

The Decade of Discovery in Astronomy and Astrophysics - National Research Council. This report summarizes the current status of astronomical and astrophysical research, surveys existing programs, describes technological developments needed for future instruments and makes recommendations for ground- and spacebased initiatives for the coming decade. A valuable resource for general readers interested in future research and funding priorities in these fields. Natl Acad Pr, 1991, 181 p., illus./color plates, paperback, \$24.95.

The Healing Brain: A Scientific Reader -Robert Ornstein and Charles Swencionis, Eds. Studies have shown that psychological states and life traumas can adversely affect the immune system. In this book, eminent psychiatrists, psychologists and neuroscientists describe investigations of brain-mind-body relationships that are changing scientists' perceptions of health and illness. The Life and Death of a Druid Prince: The Story of Lindow Man, an Archaeological Sensation - Anne Ross and Don Robins. A speculative account of the events leading to the death of the man whose 2,000-year-old torso was found well preserved in an English peat bog. Tracing the archaeological investigation as if it were a detective story, the authors reconstruct Lindow Man's life and death in the context of Celtic Britain and the threatened Druid religion. - Frederick H. Pough. This simplified version of the popular "Peterson Field Guide" illustrates and describes common rocks and minerals, provides basic explanations of how and where the different types form, and explains how beginners can find and identify them. A handy, pocket-sized guide for fledgling collectors. HM, 1991, 128 p., color illus., paperback, \$4.95.

The Psychology of Jealousy and Envy-Peter Salovey, Ed. A well-referenced, scholarly overview of current research on jealousy and envy. One major section focuses on personality and other innate factors affecting an individual's likelihood of experiencing jealousy or envy; another focuses on interpersonal interaction and social constraints on the expression of jealousy. A third section examines the larger framework of family, nationality and ethnicity, discussing how this affects a person's sense of self, which in turn helps define the situations in which an individual is vulnerable to feeling envy or jealousy. Of interest to professionals and students in social psychology, clinical psychology or sociology. Guilford Pr, 1991, 293 p., hardcover, \$35.00.

When is a Pig a Hog? A Guide to Confoundingly Related English Words — Bernice Randall. Explains the subtle (and sometimes not-so-subtle) differences between terms that are often mistakenly interchanged, such as gem/jewel, number/numeral, meteor/meteorite, and centripetal/centrifugal. Subject sections include "Nature and Science," "Our Bodies and Medicine," and "The Arts." Prentice Hall Pr, 1991, 328 p., hardcover, \$19.95.
