
In *Stones, Bones, and Ancient Cities,* Professor Lawrence Robbins transports the reader to the sites that have shaped our understanding of early civilizations and of prehistoric man. He intimately profiles the gifted, fortunate people who often braved public skepticism as they delved into our past.

- Donald Johnson unearthed the fossilized australopithecine called Lucy. Is she the "missing link" between the apes and our bipedal ancestors?
- In 1914, three French brothers lowered themselves into a dark sinkhole near Tuc d'Audoubert. In a network of caverns they found breathtaking cave paintings, more than 15,000 years old.

Among the several dozen other great discoveries covered by Robbins are King Tutankhamen's tomb in the Valley of the Kings; the ruins of Great Zimbabwe, hub of ancient southeast African civilization; the Rosetta Stone, key to the Egyptians' complex hieroglyphics; China's buried clay army of Qin-Shi-Huang; and the lost cities of Pompeii and Herculaneum. In a lively, suspenseful style Robbins brings the excitement of these and other discoveries to life. He shows how the modern disciplines of anthropology, archaeology and paleoanthropology reveal previously unknown truths. Scholars, students and laypersons will treasure this rich journey through time to the sites that mark the origins of humankind.
