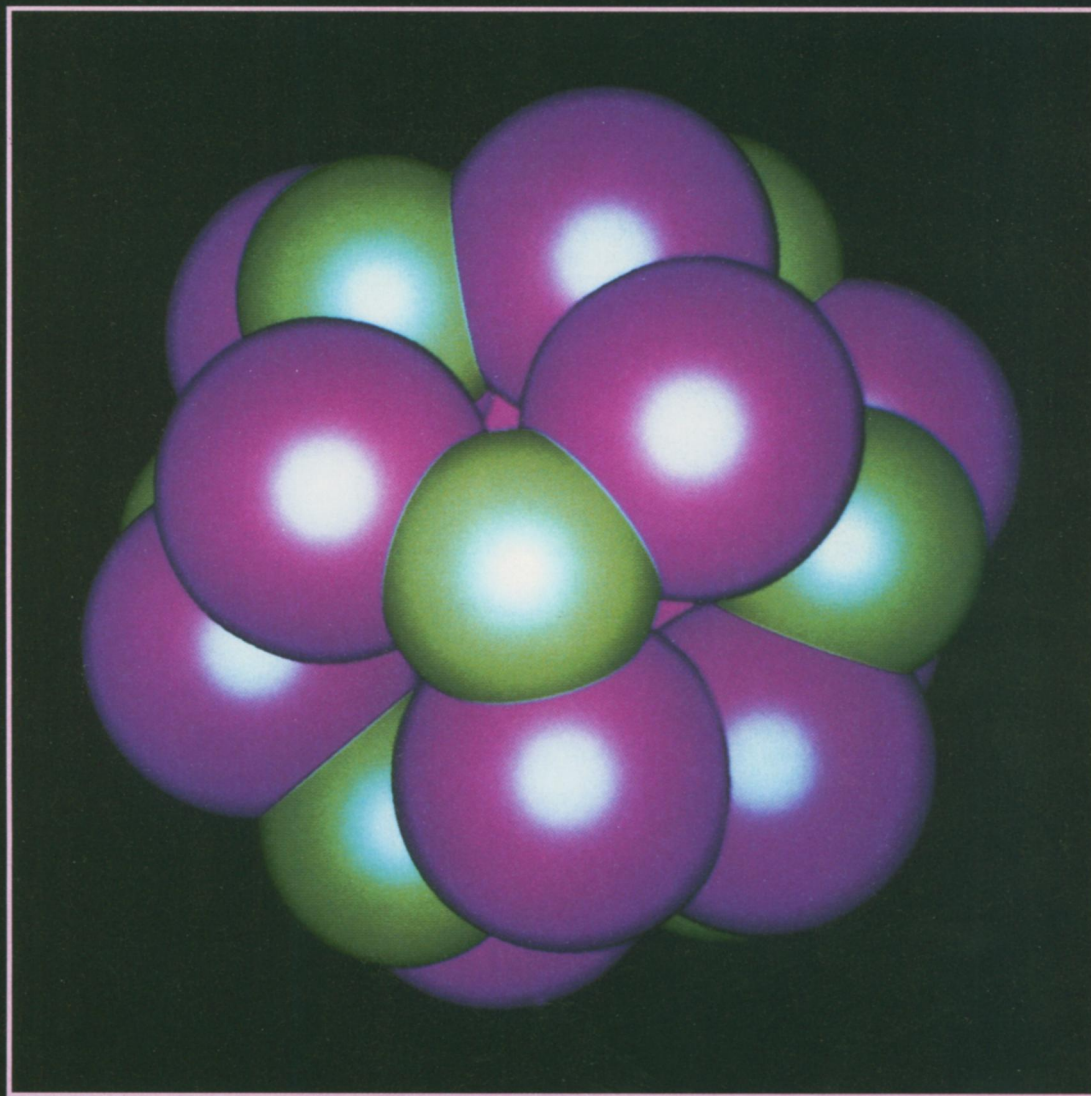

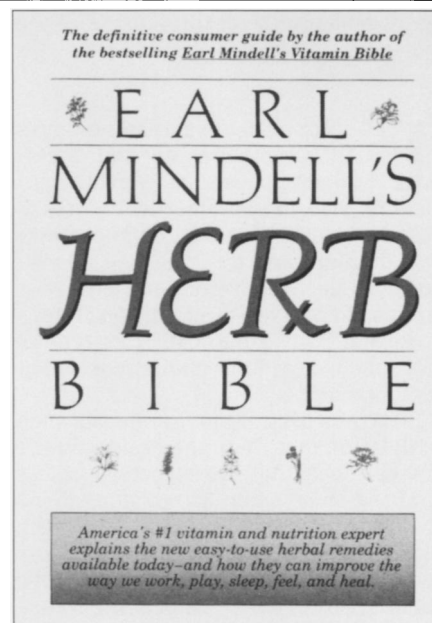

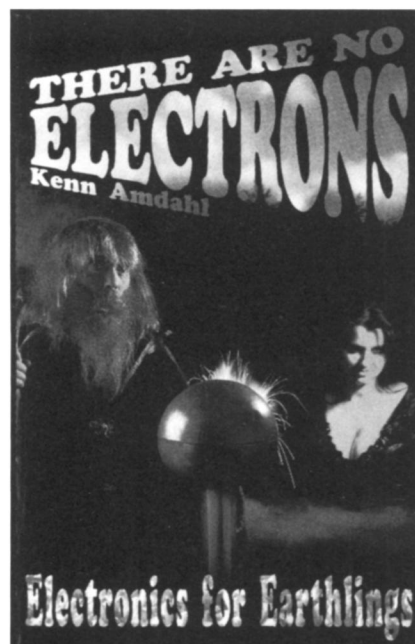

Most of us think about our circula-
tory system only when something
goes wrong, but the amazing story
of how it goes right — "mag-
nificently right," as author Steven
Vogel puts it — is equally worthy of
our attention. It is physically re-
markable, bringing food to (and
removing waste from) a hundred
trillion cells, coursing through
60,000 miles of arteries and veins
(equivalent to over twice around the
earth at the equator). And it is also
intriguing. For instance, blood leav-

ing the heart flows rapidly through
the arteries, then slows down dra-
matically in the capillaries (to a
speed of one mile every fifty days),
but in the veins, on its way back to
the heart, it speeds up again. How?
