This book for young readers chronicles the events leading up to the breaking of the sound barrier, with descriptions of the men and women who risked their lives to achieve supersonic flight. Among them were Hanna Reitsch, a test pilot for Nazi Germany's Komet program, and Chuck Yeager, who flew the X-I aircraft that broke the sound barrier. For ages 10 and up. Dawn Behind the Dawn: A Search for the Earthly Paradise — Geoffrey Ashe. Citing new archaeological evidence, this historian and specialist in mythology argues that goddess worship was widespread among Eurasian communities during Paleolithic times. An "egalitarian golden age" ended, he suggests, when the goddess, or life power, was replaced in these cultures by a male-dominated pantheon of gods. H Holt & Co, 1992, 274 p., hardcover, \$24.95.

A geoarchaeologist draws on modern science, legends, and ancient poetry to decipher the Atlantis legend, which he concludes is an ancient Egyptian account of the Trojan war. Supporting evidence includes complete, literal translations of two passages in which Plato describes Atlantis. Morrow, 1992, 256 p., hardcover, \$25.00.

Glaciers — Michael Hambrey and Jurg Alean. A professor of earth sciences and a specialist in ice avalanches explore glaciers, examining climate, environmental change, and natural history. The reader is transported to the Alps, the Himalayas, Scandinavia, Iceland, Antarctica, the Andes, and Alaska. The authors explain catastrophes such as avalanches, lake bursts, and the eruption of glacier-covered volcanoes and review the lasting impact of glaciers on the natural landscape. Generously illustrated with color and black-and-white photographs. Cambridge U Pr, 1992, 208 p., hardcover, \$29.95.

Recipes from an Ecological Kitchen: Healthy Meals for You and the Planet — Lorna J. Sass. This culinary historian and cookbook author has developed more than 250 original, meatless recipes to help alleviate the effects of meat-centered diets on human health and the ecosystem. Citing statistics that underscore the waste of grain and the devastation of land, water, and human resources resulting from large-scale cattle rearing, she offers guiding principles for maintaining an ecological kitchen. **Rx2000:** Breakthroughs in Health, Medicine, and Longevity by the Year 2000 and Beyond — Jeffrey A. Fisher. An anatomical and clinical pathologist forecasts the development and availability of breakthrough cures, diagnostic procedures, and preventive techniques for the next 40 years. Fisher's calendar includes routine use of artificial organs, drugs to prevent breast cancer, and reliable tests to indicate a predisposition to cystic fibrosis, heart disease, cancer, osteoporosis, and schizophrenia. S&S, 1992, 271 p., hardcover, \$22.00.

Theories of the Mind: A Compelling Investigation into the Ideas of Leading Philosophers on the Nature of the Mind and Its Relation to the Body — Stephen Priest. A lecturer in the department of philosophy at the University of Edinburgh presents lay readers with a philosophical puzzle: What is the relationship between the body and mind? He surveys conflicting theories of leading philosophers, provides a critical analysis of their main contributions, and concludes with his own solution. HM, 1991, 233 p., paperback, \$9.95.

Women's Madness: Misogyny or Mental Illness? — Jane Ussher. A lecturer in psychology examines the nature and causes of depression in women and questions whether the psychiatric and medical professions define as pathological what may be sane reactions to oppression and violence. She analyzes current practices of intervention and proposes alternative methods of treatment that reconcile the needs of individual women with the needs of women as a group.
