




The recent interpretation of Maya hieroglyphs has given us the first written history of the New World as it existed before the European invasion. A Forest of Kings is the story of Maya kingship, from the beginning of its institution and the first great pyramid builders two thousand years ago to the decline of Maya civilization and its destruction by the Spanish. Here the great historic rulers of Precolumbian civilization come to life again with the rediscovery of their language. At its height, Maya civilization flourished under great kings like Shield-Jaguar, who ruled for more than sixty years, expanding his kingdom and building some of the most impressive works of architecture in the ancient world. Long placed on a mist-shrouded pedestal as austere, peaceful stargazers, the Maya elites are now known to have been the rulers of populous, aggressive city-states.

Kingship was the primary political and religious institution of the ancient Maya and unified the Maya view of art, politics, war and religion. The Maya were at once highly civilized, skilled in architecture and astronomy, and, to us, violent and barbaric, engaging in ritual bloodletting and many wars.

The true artistry of the Maya glyphs and artifacts is evident in the 24-page color section. In addition, Maya history is brought clearly to life through the more than 250 illustrations, maps and charts that are found throughout the text.


