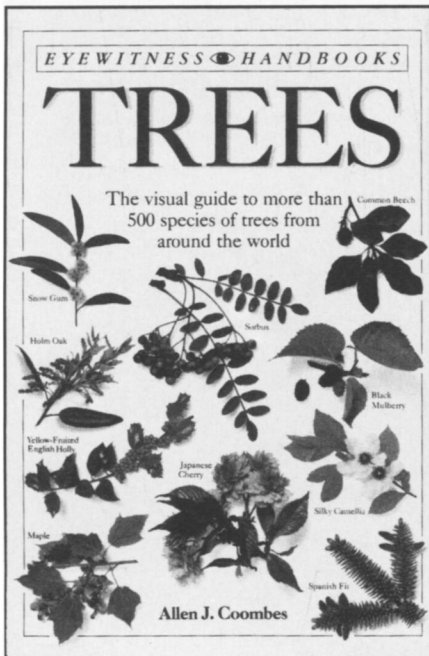

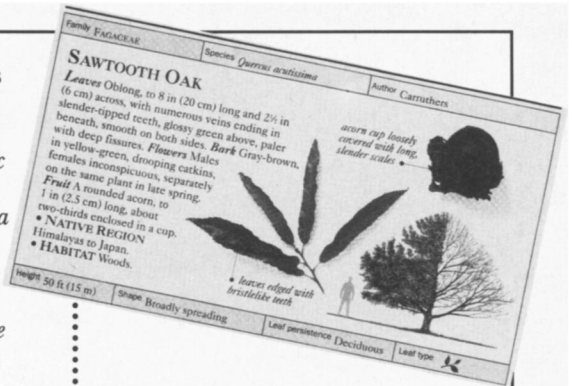

In addition, each entry features an illustration showing the spread and leaves of the tree, as well as color-coded bands that provide at-a-glance facts for quick reference. Finally, a concise glossary provides instant understanding of botanical terms.

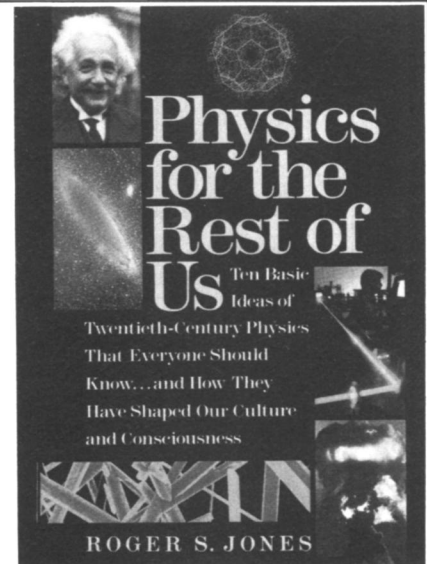
Jones also explores the impact of these ideas on humanist, ethical, psychological, aesthetic, and spiritual concerns, addressing such questions as:
