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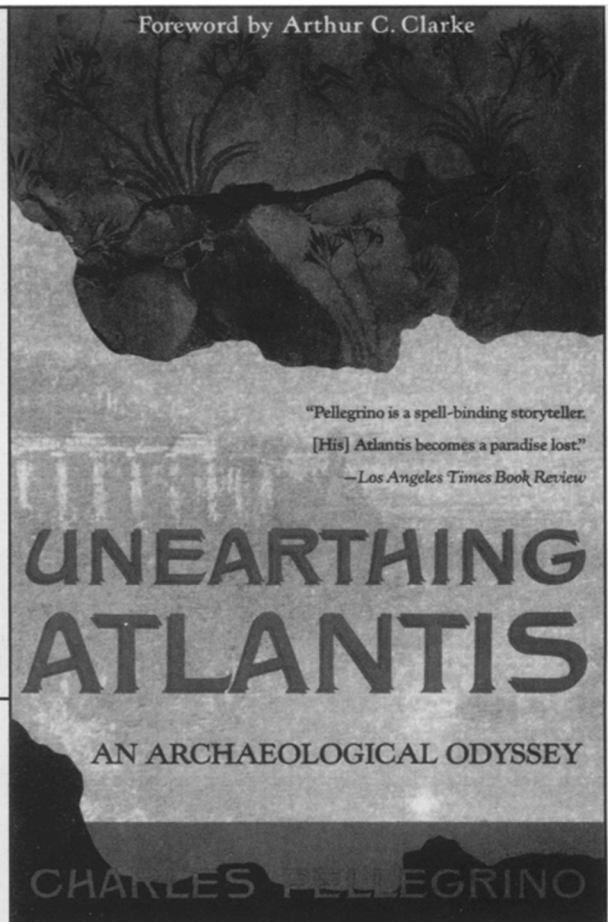
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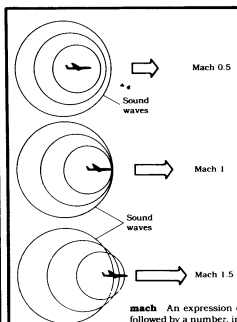
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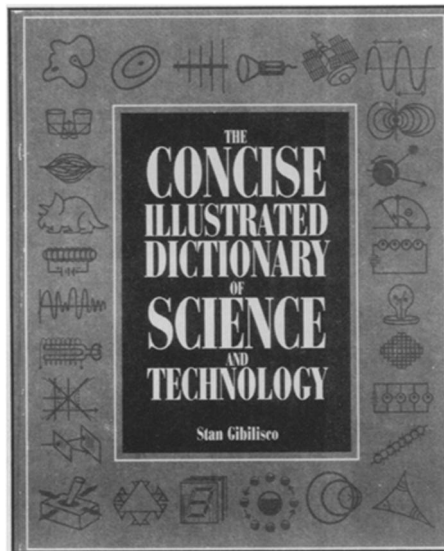
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mach An expression of speed. Written mach followed by a number, indicating the speed relative to sound. The drawing shows an aircraft moving at mach 0.5 (half the speed of sound), mach 1.0 (the speed of sound) and mach 1.5 (one and a half times the speed of sound). At mach 1.0, about 700 miles per hour in the air, the aircraft just keeps up with sound waves in front of it. This compression causes the sonic boom. See sonic boom, speed of sound.
