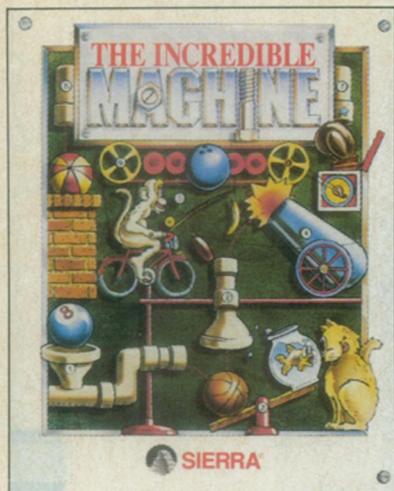


# GET KIDS LEARNING USING COMPUTERS!

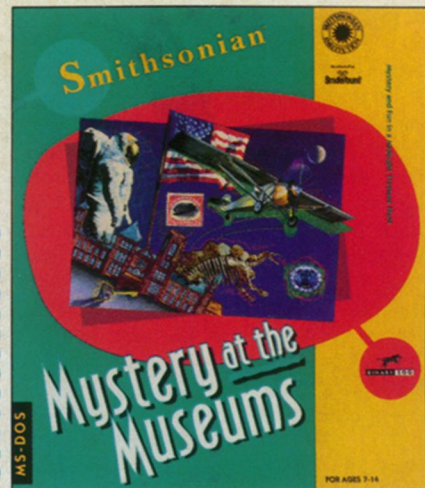
