Volcanoes of North America United States and Canada

Geologically youthful volcanic activity has occurred in nearly all of the western United States and Canada, and modern eruptions are frequent in Alaska and Hawaii. However, the only thorough treatment of North American volcanoes available before now was written 100 years ago — and a great deal of pertinent information has been acquired in the meantime. *Volcanoes of North America* capitalizes on this vast body of more recent knowledge to present, in a single source, detailed information about volcanoes found in the continental United States, Alaska, Hawaii, and Canada. It contains brief accounts, written by leading experts in volcanology, of over 250 volcanoes and volcanic fields formed during the past five million years. Precise locations and type classifications are given, as are compositional analyses and eruptive histories. Also provided are photographs, locational maps, and extremely helpful instructions on how to reach each volcano.

Volcanoes of North America will be a standard reference work for practicing volcanologists, petrologists, geochemists, and, to some extent, geographers. In addition, much of the book is sufficiently nontechnical for the lay reader, and the maps and "How to get there" sections make it highly valuable for anyone interested in natural history or fascinated by volcanoes.

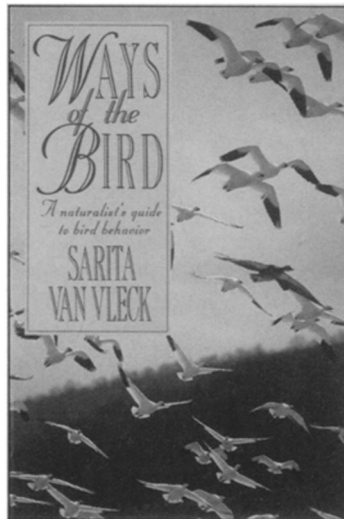
