On April 23, 1992, NASA's \$150 million COBE (Cosmic Background Explorer) satellite made one of the most monumental scientific breakthroughs of our century: the discovery of the long-sought "ripples in the fabric of space-time." 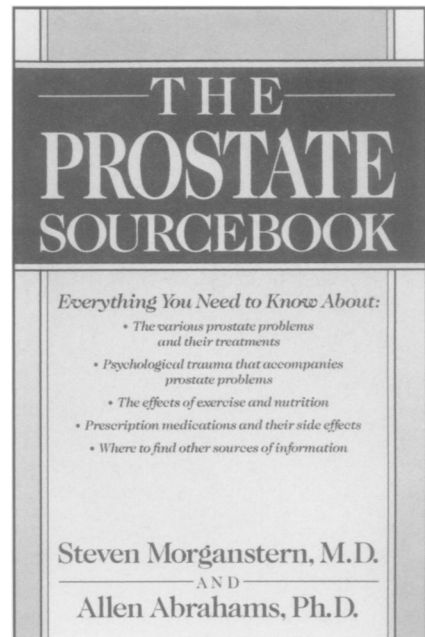
