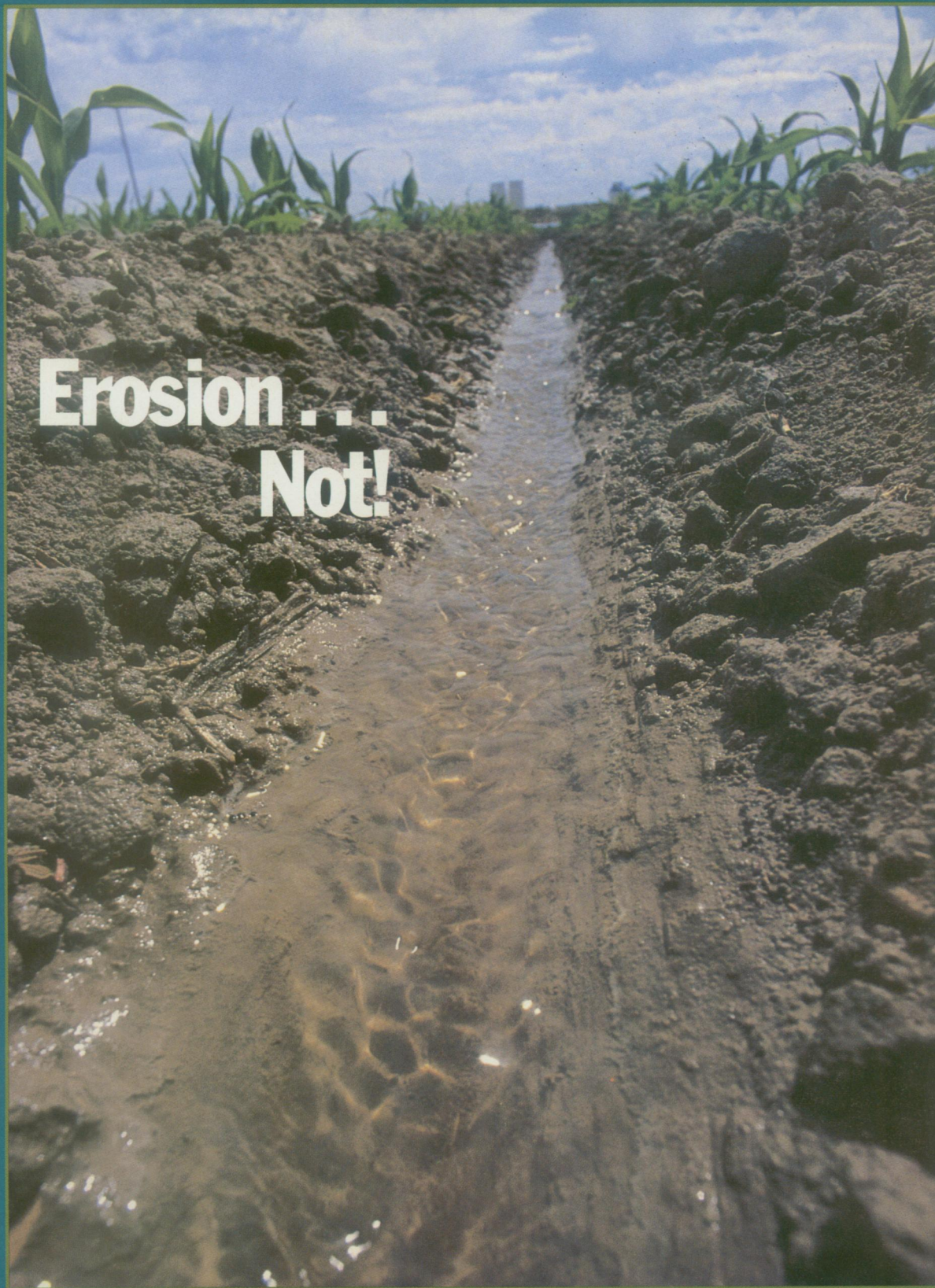


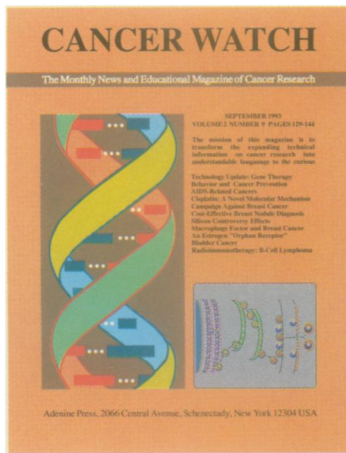

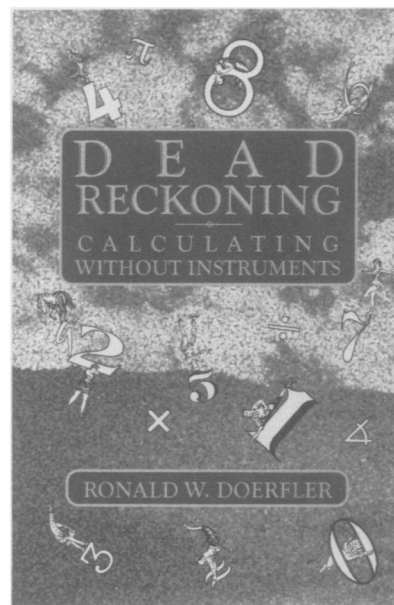
This book describes useful techniques and algorithms for mentally calculating products, quotients, roots of non-perfect powers, and trigonometric, logarithmic, and exponential values. These methods range from very old to brand new. While speed is an objective of these techniques, they are not shortcuts. Rather, they are ways to sharpen the mental skills needed to perform “mathematical acrobatics.”

*Dead Reckoning* is the culmination of several years’ research into the methods of mathematical geniuses such as Pascal, Aitken, and many others. Often called “lightning calculators” because of their speed and accuracy, these scientists mastered their craft through years of practice

and by memorizing large mathematical tables. Doerfler merges the tools of these scholars with modern numerical analysis. The result is a collection of algorithms that use elementary multiplication and division, require less memorization, and provide answers that are accurate to at least three decimal places, and often many more.

Doerfler’s extremely approachable style will befriend anyone who has ever attempted mental calculation.

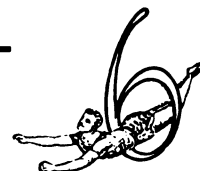

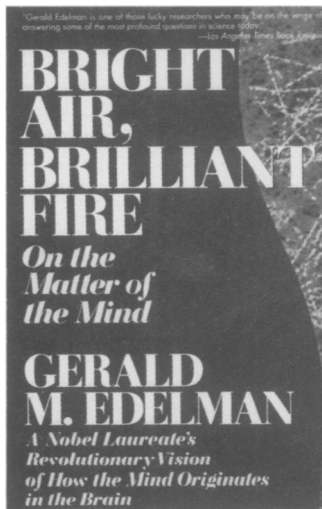

We are on the verge of a revolution in neuroscience as significant as the Galilean revolution in physics or the Darwinian revolution in biology. Nobel laureate Gerald M. Edelman takes issue with the many current cognitive and behavioral approaches to the brain that leave biology out of the picture, and argues that the workings of the brain more closely resemble the living ecology of a jungle than they do the activities of a computer.
