
Know Your Pets

How well do you know your dog? He lives in your home, welcomes your love, relies on your care — but what is he *really* thinking? Using a photographic approach, this book offers new insight into how a dog relates to other canines, why he adapts so well to human company, and why and how he defends his territory. Know Your Dog holds the keys you need to unlock the mysteries of your dog's fascinating behavior.

Dr. Bruce Fogle, an authority on pet behavior, has observed hundreds of dogs during his years as a veterinarian. With warmth and wisdom, he reveals the true relationships between dogs and their owners. Every move a dog makes — the wagging tail, the excited bark, the flicking ears, the wriggling body — tells you, and every other dog, what he is thinking and what his next move will be. Know Your Dog interprets his language so you can understand what your pet is saying. And because significant differences between breeds do exist, Dr. Fogle has included a troubleshooter's guide designed to help pinpoint those variations in character and temperament. With his help, dog owners will quickly come to recognize the telltale signs of canine boredom and learn how to change unac-


ceptable behavior. More than 350 full-color photographs taken especially for this book explore dogs from all the angles — running, rollicking, romping, and

Know Your Cat explains why your cat is affectionate one moment and fiercely independent the next, why he stakes out his own territory but simultaneously invades yours, how he makes friends with other family pets, and how he learns to survive in the "jungle" you call home. In other words, Know Your Cat tells you everything you want to know about your cat and his enigmatic behavior.

Dr. Fogle identifies how cats communicate through posture, body language, facial expressions, "speaking" (meowing and hissing) and rituals like rubbing, swatting, and grooming. He discusses the differences between learned behavior and instinctual action, the importance of a cat's sensory perceptions like smell, touch, and sound — and when a cat's eccentricities are due to genetics or are merely a matter of individual temperament.

Highlighting Dr. Fogle's text are more than 350 remarkable color photographs which capture the cat's unending antics and moods. Commissioned especially for this book, these pictures detail the cat's life, from the intimacy of birth through every stage of growth from kittenhood to maturity.

Whether your feline is a sophisticated Siamese or a loveable marmalade plucked from the alley, Know Your Cat will reveal the motives behind his quixotic behavior. from Dorling Kindersley
