
Windows on the Socially Withdrawn

quirrels in the bird feeder, raccoons in the garbage, Canada geese on the lawn, rabbits in the garden, deer in the orchard—during forty years in the suburbs A.B.C. Whipple has coped with them all. *Critters* recounts how the wildlife that was supposed to be banished by suburban development has instead had a population explosion right in everybody's backyard.

Whipple became an amateur naturalist, discovering many fascinating facts of suburban fauna: why the skunk has a white-striped back; why geese and swans fly in V-formation; why squirrels and bats have natural chastity belts; how the southern mocking bird came north along 1-95—not

to mention the eighteenth-century squirrels that helped us win our independence from Britain.

Critters is full of engaging suburban wildlife: gulls bouncing golf balls, Canada geese joining picnics, bats in


deadly dogfights, a squirrel that enjoys TV, and a raccoon addicted to Beethoven.






