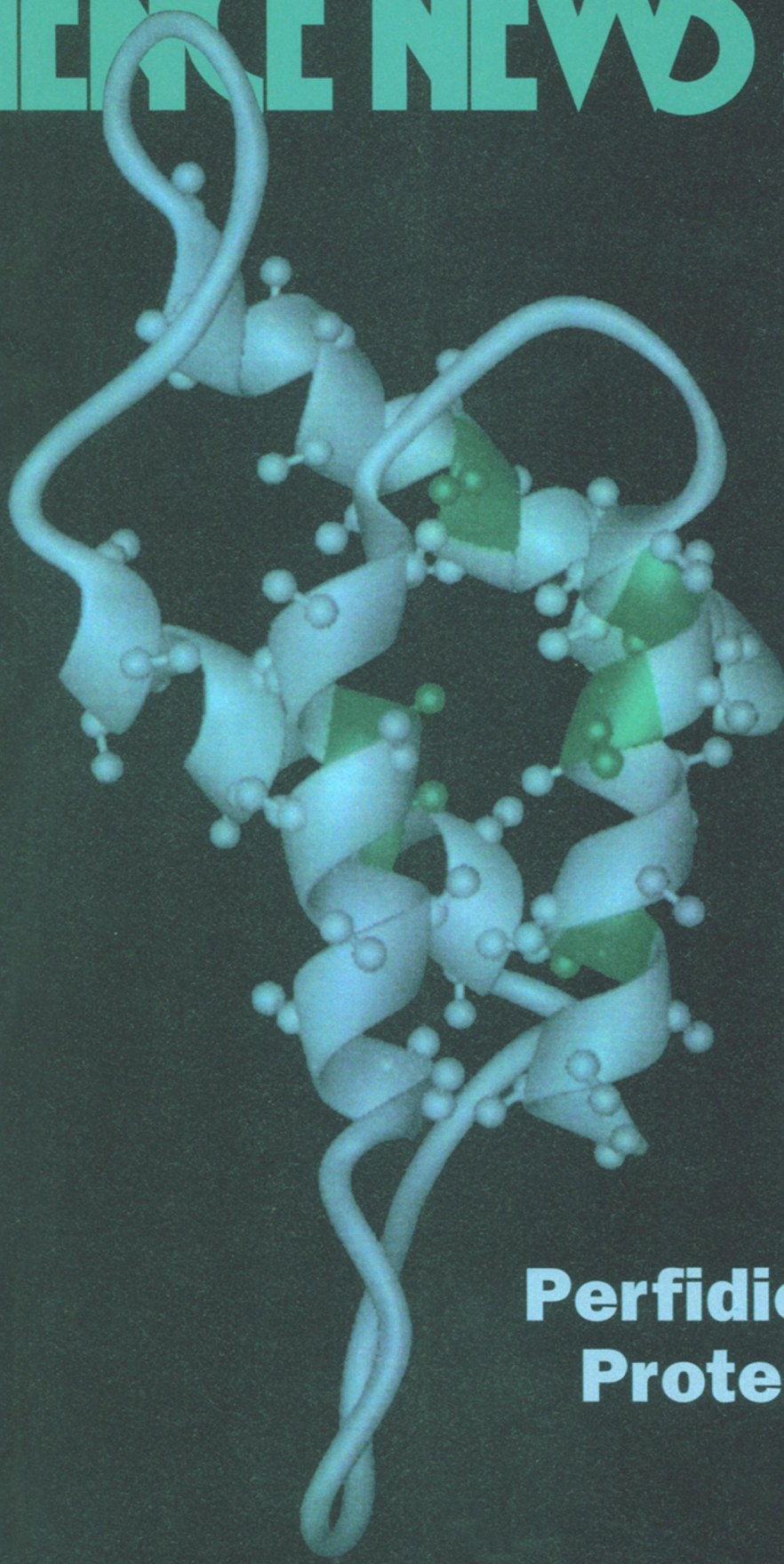

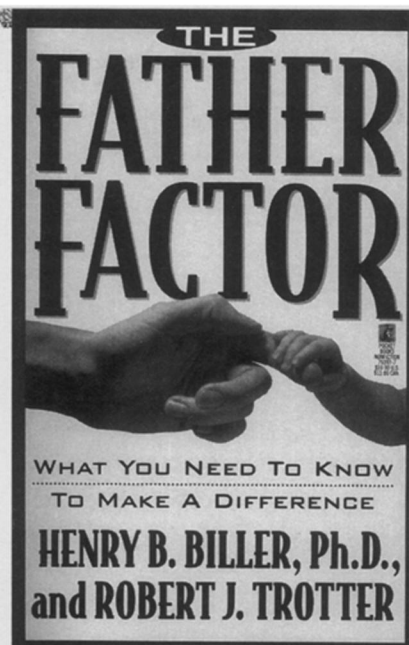
Perfidious Protein

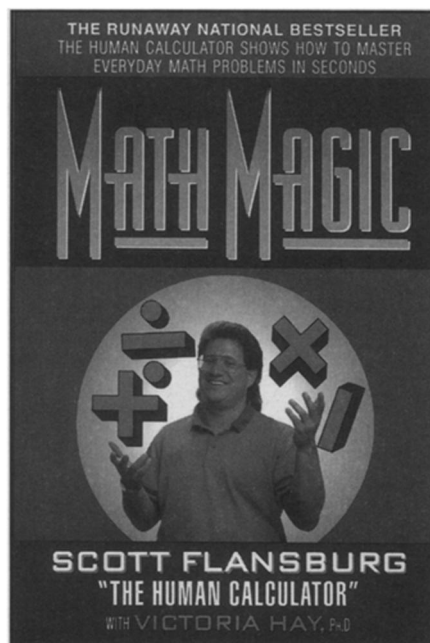
