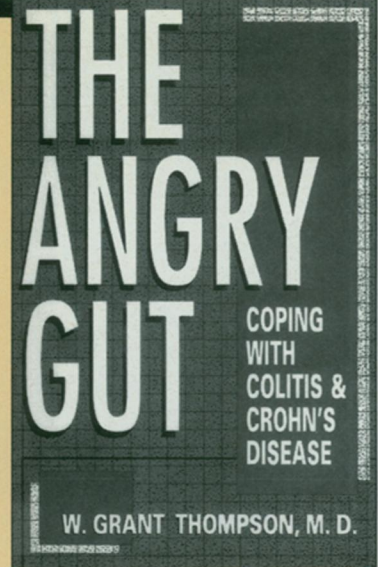
Supernova Saga

In the spirit of the highly acclaimed *Gut Reactions*, Dr. W. Grant Thompson shares his expertise on how to cope with two widespread and debilitating diseases — colitis and Crohn's disease.

Dr. Thompson, an international expert and chief of a hospital gastroenterology unit, highlights the significant similarities and differences of these two syndromes and stresses the importance of a correct diagnosis. 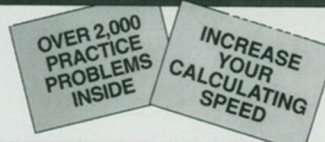

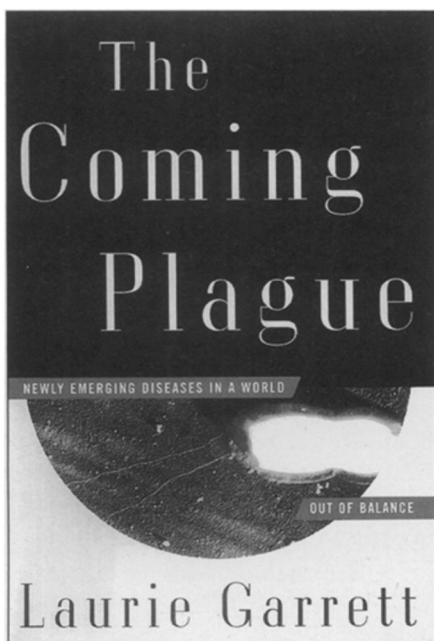

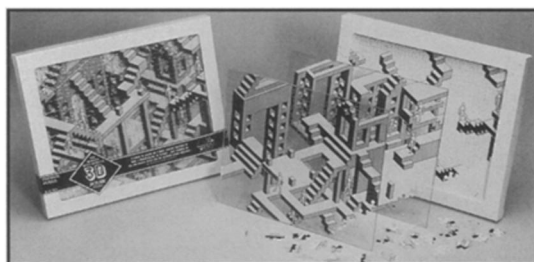
Based on extensive interviews with leading experts in virology, molecular biology, disease ecology, and medicine, as well as field research in sub-Saharan Africa, Western Europe, Central America, and the United States, *The Coming Plague* examines newly identified viruses such as HIV and HIV-II, Lassa, and the mysterious Ebola; old viruses in new locations, such as hantavirus, yellow fever, and dengue; and mutant strains of diseases such as cholera, toxic shock-producing staph, and strep, and *E. coli* O157:H7.

The Coming Plague uncovers the conditions that favor—even promote—the mutation and spread of deadly viruses and microbes—from inadequate air circulation on airplanes to the improper use of antibiotics and antivirals, from high-intensity local warfare to massive refugee migrations—while pointing to solutions to prevent the onslaught of disease.

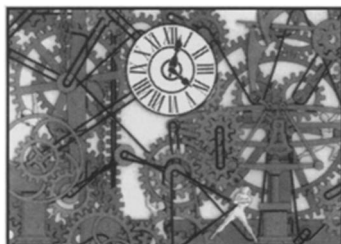

3-D Jigsaw Puzzles Boggle the Mind and Entertain for Hours

Looking at the two-dimensional pictures in the boxes doesn't help much with these puzzles as there are three puzzles in one, which make a three-dimensional image when complete. The challenge is determining if the piece in your hand is part of the foreground, middle ground, or background or even which area is which. Three plastic puzzles sandwiched between two thick acrylic boards create the three-dimensional effect. Playsheets for use during puzzle assembly and a hole in the back of the box enabling you to hang your finished product, aid in the functionality of these unique jigsaws.

Each puzzle contains 540 pieces and measures 11 1/2" x 9 1/4" when complete.
