In this stimulating and timely book, Amit Goswami shatters the widely held belief that matter is the primary "stuff" of creation, and proposes instead that consciousness is the true foundation of all we know and perceive. He demonstrates that our traditional assumptions about how the world works cannot explain the latest results from quantum physics, and that by adopting a philosophy of idealism, in which consciousness is primary and matter secondary, we can achieve a paradox-free interpretation of new physics.

The Self-Aware Universe is divided into four sections. Part One clarifies the basic ideas of the new physics and introduces the consciousness first, or idealist, worldview. Part Two delineates the unresolved problems and paradoxes contained in quantum physics which have troubled the sleep of the scientific community for much of this century and shows how these dilemmas disappear when we view the universe as based in consciousness. Part Three addresses the mind-body question and shows that an idealist approach can help us decipher the origins and inner workings of creativity and self-awareness. In Part Four, Goswami combines Eastern philosophy with his Western scientific education to show how idealism heals the rift between science and religion.

The Self-Aware Universe will appeal to anyone interested in new science, quantum physics, philosophy, the relationship between science and religion, psychology, personal growth, consciousness, and/or mysticism. It is written in a friendly and inviting manner that will entice the layperson, while offering open-minded scientists fresh explanations to paradoxes that have been baffling them for years. —from Tarcher/Putnam

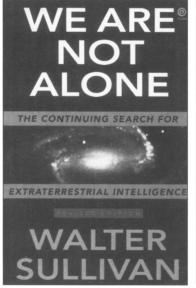




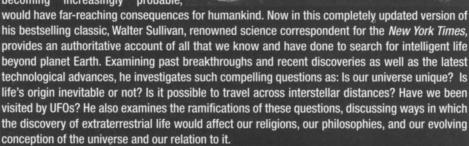
