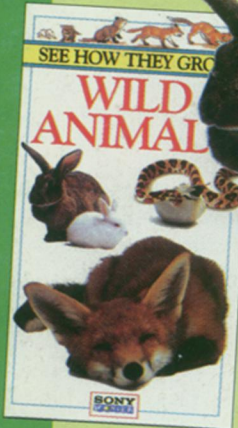
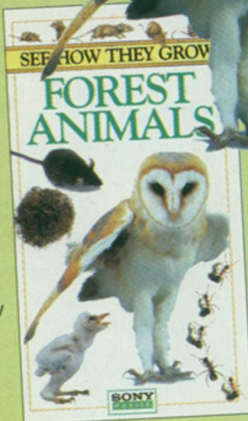


See Science Inside and Out

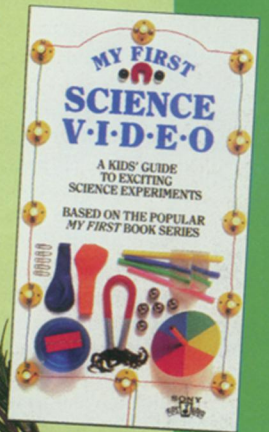

Did you ever wonder how fingerprinting is done, how weather is predicted?

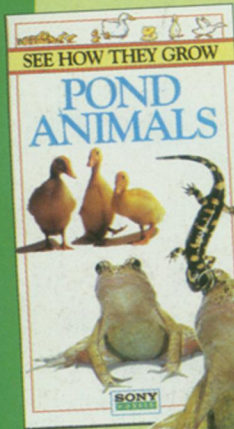
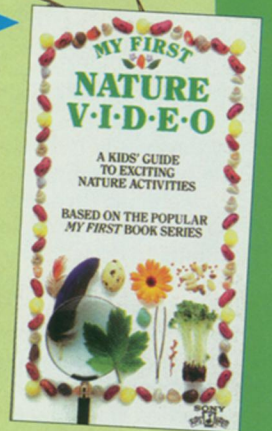
My First Science Video will explore these and other fascinating topics with experiments that are easy to perform.
