The tale begins more than 2 billion years ago, when an ancient continent split, creating oceanfront property in what is now western Idaho. Pacific islands smashed into that coastline, making large parts of Washington and Oregon. These events were followed by monstrous volcanic eruptions, catastrophic ice age floods, and mountains rising to an accompaniment of earthquakes. Written in engaging prose and generously illustrated, Northwest Exposures is a must-read for anyone interested in the geologic history recorded in the landscape.




