

OU'VE HEARD ABOUT ALICE'S ADVENTURES THROUGH THE LOOKING GLASS. Well, Alice is about to embark on another amazing journey. She's going to shrink again—to the size of a nuclear particle—but she's not going down the rabbit hole. She's headed for Quantumland.

And what is Quantumland? Think of it as an intellectual amusement park smaller than an atom, where every ride, game, and attraction demonstrates a different aspect of quantum mechanics. In this masterful blend of fantasy and science, Robert Gilmore uses the allegory of Alice's travels to make the uncertainty principle, Pauli's principle, high-energy particle physics, and other crucial parts of quantum theory accessible and exciting.

Once in Quantumland, Alice experiences various quantum effects (at one point going

backward in time and running into herself). She also meets a number of strange characters who help her (and you) understand the nature of the quantum world. There is:

- the Uncertain Accountant, whose attempts to balance the books at the Heisenberg Energy Bank are being flummoxed by energy fluctuations;
- the Three Quark Brothers, who take Alice around the floor in one of the Castle Rutherford's famous Collider Dances:
- the Emperor, whose conscious mind makes his new clothes real; and more.

Cleverly conceived and written, and delightfully illustrated, Alice in Quantumland brings some crucial yet often elusive scientific concepts within reach of the everyday reader. You don't need to know much about mathematics to follow our hero-


ine's escapades. All you need is a taste for intellectual adventure and healthy curiosity about the world around us. —from Copernicus
