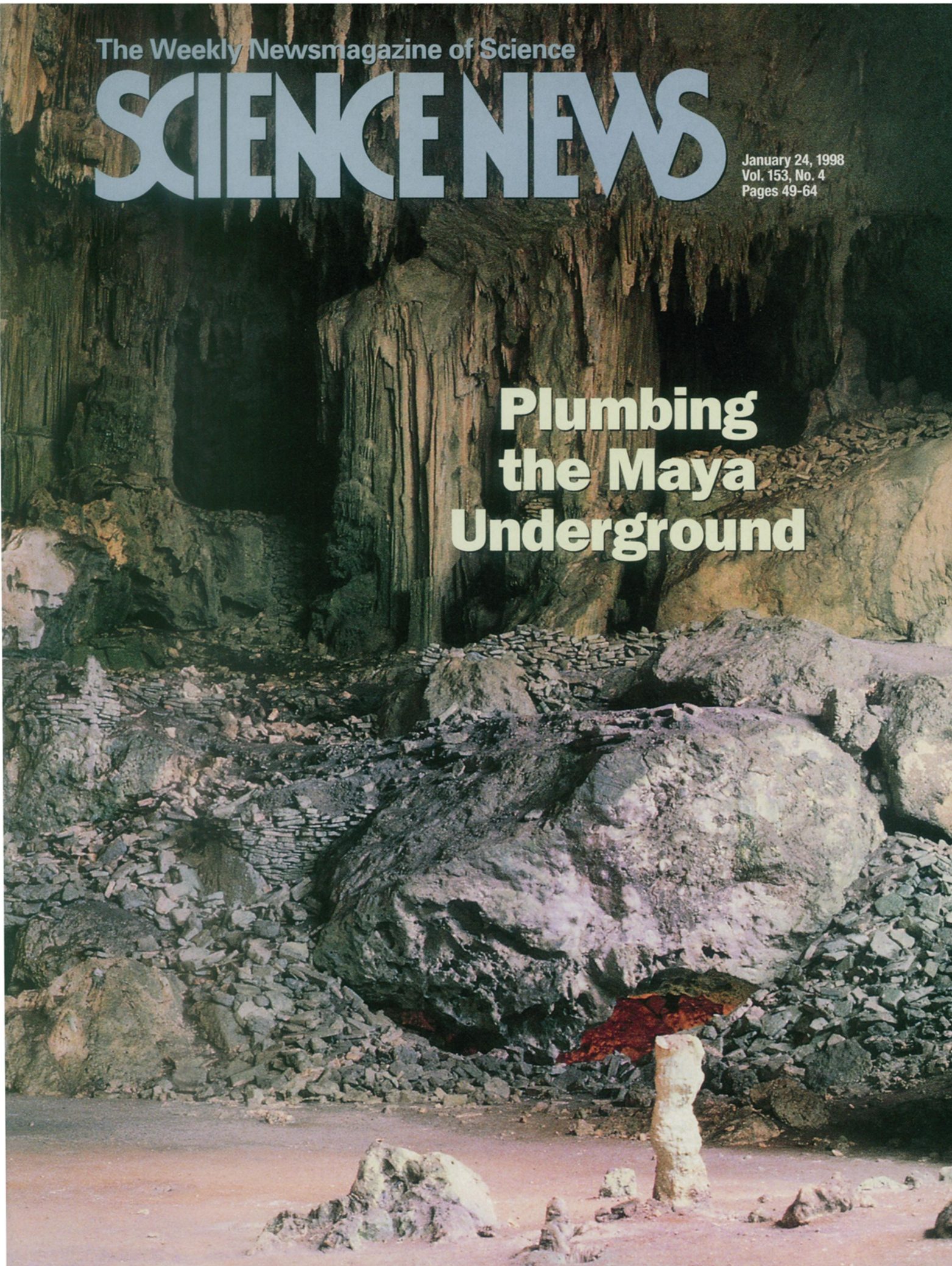


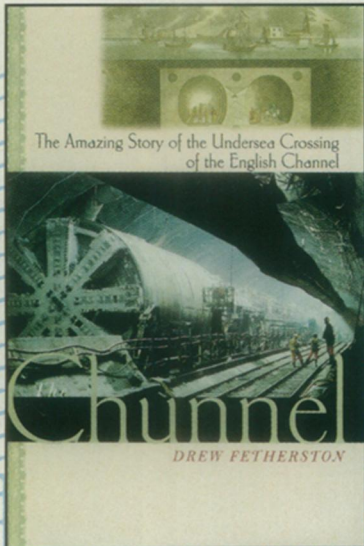

For more than 8,000 years, the English Channel separated the European continent from the island that would become Great Britain. Roman legions landed near what is now Dover in A.D. 43, on their way to conquer Britain. The pivotal battle that decided the unhappy fate of the Spanish Armada took place in the water passage Shakespeare called a "moat," while in our own century the Channel helped protect England from a Nazi invasion.

For centuries, men and women dreamed of a direct link between England and the Continent. For some, the dream was of a giant bridge that would span the Dover Strait; others proposed an undersea tunnel. Many feared that the link would expose England to invasion. But there were a few on both sides of the Channel who preserved the dream of a simple, quick, safe means of travel between

Britain and France.

Drew Fetherston's epic chronicle of the Channel Tunnel is the story of these dreamers and those who finally made the dream a reality. Conceived by hard-headed businessmen and intended to make money, the tunnel project became a fiscal disaster. Fetherston's book is a fascinating narrative of high risk and high finance, of culture clashes and reckless blunders. But the tunnel was also a spectacular feat of engineering, and Fetherston brings to vivid life the

accomplishments of those who designed it and drove it beneath the Channel's stormy waters. We get to know not only an array of engineers and financiers, tunnelers and scientists, politicians and businessmen, but the English Channel itself—its shallows and unique geology, its layers of chalk and clay, and its spectacular history.

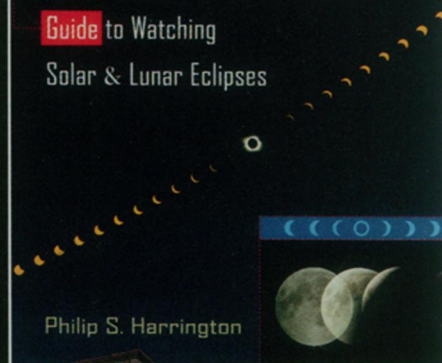
