We pick up the trail in America during the Revolutionary War, when General Howe's mastiff accidentally wandered behind enemy lines. This dog, of fine English breeding, was saved

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
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by none other than General George Washington, who fed the lost pup and sent him promptly back to his British owner under a flag of truce.

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
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
